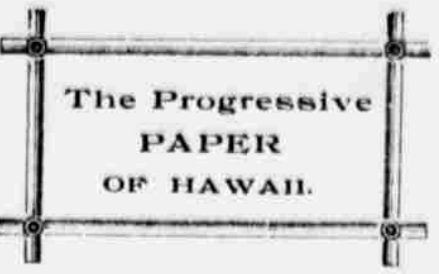

**Preparations are on Foot for Old Fashioned American Day.**

**Fratricide and Suicide.**  
 New York, May 8.—Paul Leicester Ford, the novelist, was shot through the heart by his brother, Malcolm Webster Ford, this morning. The murderer then turned the weapon upon himself and gave himself an almost exactly similar wound. The two brothers died within a few feet of each other. The brother who did the shooting had been disinherited because he chose to follow an athletic instead of a literary career. In financial straits, he went to his brother for aid and they quarrelled. The murdered brother was the author of historical works and the two successful novels, "The Honorable Peter Sterling" and "Janice Meredith."
