SENATOR HEYBURN AGAINST RESERVES

Withdrawing Large Areas from Development in Idaho Excites the Senator's Ire

Senator Heyburn is to be commended for the fight he is making against the establishment of forest reserves in Northern Idaho. This matter of throwing large areas of the state into a reserve where all progress and development becomes an impossibility, is something that may well engross the serious attention of the people of Idaho. The government has recently withdrawn large areas in Shoshone county. The dead line reaches right into the city limits of the towns of Wallace and Wardner. No sound reason exists for such action. The usual arguments in favor of forest reserves do not apply in Northern Idaho.

Here near Bonners Ferry we have a sample of the baneful effects of the forest reserve policy. All the territory North and East of the Kootenai River in Idaho has been withdrawn from settlement with a view to making a new forest reserve. This action was taken some three years ago. Since that date new

settlers have been barred out of the withdrawn area and all development has been at a standstill. The country would easily sustain 1000 people now, and thousands more in a few years, and they would bear their share of the burdens of developing a new country—maintain schools, building roads, growing marketable products and producing wealth.

The proposed Kootenai Forest Reserve does not contain enough timber to justify a reserve, considering its large area. The holding up of this land is a great evil. Senator Heyburn deserves especial consideration for the valiant fight he is making against the withdrawal of these and other lands from settlement. It is pleasing also to note that Governor Gooding, as chief executive of the state, is throwing his influence with the Senator in this fight, as is also Congressman Burton L. French. Let us commend and encourage these public servants in their good work.

THE ROUTE OF THE S. AND I. RY

The Definite Location of the New Railway Line is not yet announced.

Great activity is being displayed by the promoters of the Spokane & International Railway, and they are rushing preliminaries so as to start construction at as early a date as possible.

The route through or past Bonners Ferry does not seem to be definitely located yet. It seems to be an established fact that the Paradise Valley route is not being further considered. The line will come down on the north side to a point near the old ferry landing. It seems to be the opinion that it will cross the river at that point,

and continue to the Great Northern right-of-way, thence parallel to the Great Northern, crossing the Y about the center and then heading for the A. E. Bunting place.

General Manager Roberts was here this week with the right-of-way agent, ascertaining the cost of right-of-way along the route indicated. Contractors have looked over the line, but so far as we can ascertain no contracts have actually been let. The wagon road being constructed up the Moyie will be finished through to the International Line next week.

The Presbytery of Spokane.

In the absence of the moderator the opening sermon was preached by W. H. Jones, Fairfield, Wash. Rev. S. M. Ware, D. D., of Spokane was elected moderator and Rev. C. R. Shields, clerk. The best of harmony prevailed and much business was transacted. The work is found to be in good condition in almost all the fields. Adjournment was taken Wednesday evening to meet in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, next October. Rev. C. R. Shields and Elder Dr. Connell were elected commissioners to the General Assembly which meets in Winona, Indiana, May 18.

Justice Kent's Court.

Case Soo Yen vs. Soo Kee. Civil action for \$142; tried by jury. Verdict was in favor of defendant for \$195 and costs, \$26.65. Plaintiff paid costs and \$50 to defendant as settlement in full.

In the case of the State of Idaho vs. Fred Muttner, Louis Muttner, and Wm. Muttner charged with petit larceny. Defendants were brought into court and pleaded guilty to charge of stealing hay and grain from Bonners Ferry Lumber Co's barn on two different occasions, hauling same to their farm at Naples. Court after hearing the evidence committed Fred Muttner to 90 days in the county jail, fined Louis Muttner \$10 and costs, amounting in all to \$15, and discharging Wm. Muttner from custody on account of his youth, not holding him responsible, he being advised by his older brothers, Constable C. L. Collins took defendant Fred Muttner to county jail. Much surprise was felt that the boys should have made such a mistake as they have previously born a good reputation.
