we possess remarkable advantages over most agricultural sections, and even though we feel a little stagnation and are some what cramped for a few months, the golden harvest which will soon be ours, and overflowing from our full granaries will pour out to the coast and orient will more than reimburse us for the temporary pressure Great is the Potlatch. Greater still are its inhabitants and most favored of mortals.

The following taken from the Moscow Mirror exactly express our sentiments and is what this paper has advocated directly and indirectly several times. There is no doubt that North Idaho has suffered in time past in not being properly exhibited and the reappointment of the executive commissioner from the southern part of the state looks as though we would be slighted again. We are with you, neighbor, and Kendrick stands ready to cooperate in any way that will further the interests of North Idaho and especially of the two counties, Nez Perce and Latah. Let everyone come here and talk it over:

Governor Morrison has named a Boise man as Idaho's Executive Commissioner at the St. Louis Exposition. Judging from North Idaho's experience at Buffalo, we will hardly be in it for a moment. Even now plans are perfected to make irrigation the leading feature. This means South Idaho again as before. The Mirror will be glad to see the interests of South Idaho pushed to the limit, but not to the exclusion of North Idaho. One would not have known that there was any means of railway entrance to the state other than the U. P., if information at Buffalo had been all that was furnished. We do not say this in a spirit of faultfinding, but as a matter of then common comment.

The Mirror hopes to see Nez Perce and Latah counties unite in an exhibit that would astonish all comers. We can do it. Our grains, seeds, grasses, fruit, berries, minerals, forest products, dairy interests and soils would make a display that would open the eyes of the world. The matter should be taken up at once. Many things for a complete exhibit must be secured this year.

It is suggested that the Chamber of Commerce, the Business Men's Association and the Common Councils of the several towns act at once. Appoint delegates to meet at some central place—say Kendrick—and outline a plan for action. It is a matter of the utmost importance. Let us act now. Moscow and Lewiston will have fairs this fall, and Juliaetta is agitating a grain and fruit carnival. Why not see to it that the displays—as above—be prepared with reference to the Latah-Nez Perce display at St. Louis. With his knowledge gained at Chicago and Buffalo in the arranging of a display and caring for same, M. J. Wessels would be just the man for the work in hand. Then, too, he is a resident of this county and for this reason doubly interested in the best possible exhibit. In the line of fruit it is his business and he is one of the best Horticulturists in the west.

The expense would reach about \$4,000 all told. This should be apportioned to the two counties, and can be raised without delay or trouble. The matter is passed onto the Moscow and Lewiston Business Men's Associations for further action. Something must be done and at once, too.

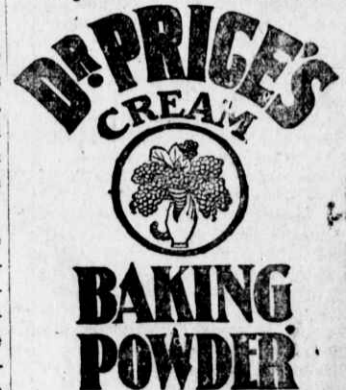
