act the scheme is to construct a telephone line herself and thus bring all of our surrounding rural population in closer touch with ourselves. We hardly think that Moscow will be able to work the scheme though we must keep our eyes open.

There are two things the city council ought to do right away and that is to pass an ordinance prohibiting cows from running on our streets during business hours. The other is the appointment of a night watchman. As to the former, on Thursday a lady from the country brought in some eggs to market, and while she was in the store negotiating for the same, a cow came along and got to rumaging in the wagon and destroyed all of the eggs. Such a thing is very exasperating and a disgrace to the town, and if the council will not pass such an ordinance our business men should compel them to do it or ask for their resignation. As to the night watchman, a petition was presented to the council at their meeting this week, signed by leading business men, asking for the appointment of such. For some reason or other the council refused to consider the petition at this meeting, laying it over until the next. We cannot see what the council means. It has cut off our watchman just when he was needed, has made the town lose prestige on account of cattle running at large and will, unless some change is made, subject us to heavy loss and damage. The honorable council had better look after the interests of the town and see that the ordinances are enforced, instead of deliberately ignoring them.

A Graft.
There is a scheme on foot originated by Patten, French, Hynes and others of Moscow for the installation of a farmers' telephone line, extending from Moscow to American Ridge. The proposed line will use the present poles as far as Grant Evans' place at the head of Brady gulch, when it will fork and go south as far as John Hutchinson's place. Other side lines will be established at many points along the main line. The organizers are endeavoring to secure subscriptions to stock among the different farmers along the line, we believe a share being held at \$100. In return for this the farmer will have the telephone put in his house and be charged \$12 a year for the use of the line. The scheme strikes us as being nothing but a graft. The farmer that is caught by it will be out his \$12.50 a year with but a trifling dividend on the amount of stock he has subscribed for, while the originators will get the plum. It seems to us to be a daring piece of impudence on the part of these fellows, and a play on the credulity of the farmer that is astounding to behold. If the plan should succeed the latter will be sure to get the worst of it in every way. Kendrick business men should fight the proposition to a finish, as it is a blow aimed at our interests here and might in time cripple us considerably. With the rural delivery and telephone to Moscow there could easily be much shopping done by the farmers in that town, while our business men could be deprived of trade to that extent.
