NEW PRINTING BILL.

Governor Morrison has signed the new printing bill which forbids the sending of county or state printing out of the state, and section 4 which is as follows:

No legal notice, advertisement or publication of any kind required or provided by the laws of the state of Idaho, to be published in a newspaper shall be published or have any force or effect as such unless the same be published in a newspaper printed in whole or in part and published in the county in which such notice or advertisement is required to be printed, having a general circulation therein, and which said newspapers, if published weekly has been continuously and uninterruptedly published in said county during a period of fifty-two consecutive weeks prior to the first publication of said notice or advertisement and, if published daily, has been published as a daily paper in said county during a period of six consecutive months prior to the first publication of said notice or advertisement. Provided, that nothing in this act shall invalidate the publication of such notice or advertisement in any newspaper which has simply changed its name or changed the place of publication from one part of the county to any other part thereof, without breaking the continuity of its regular issues for the required length of time.
