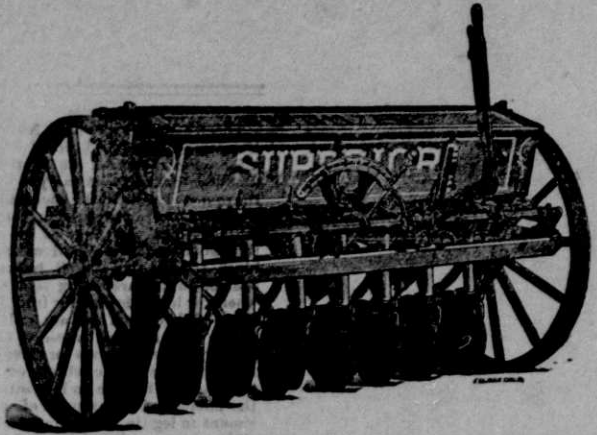

### Commuted Land \$3.75 Per Acre.

Recent Law Passed in Operation Since January 26, 1901. Local Office not Notified.

"The local land office yesterday received notification of a new law passed by the recent session of congress amending the new homestead law to provide that in cases of commutation on reservation lands the price paid per acre should be \$3.75 instead of \$1.25. This law became operative on May 26th and since that date about twenty-five parties have commuted on the basis of \$1.25 per acre. In these cases as soon as the final proof is examined by the department the local land office will be instructed to notify the entrymen that they shall be required to pay an additional sum of \$2.50 per acre in excess of the \$1.25 already paid. The local office had received no knowledge of the new law at the time of its enactment, and the information received yesterday came as a surprise.

Under the law opening the reservation to settlement, the price fixed per acre was \$3.75. The free homes bill became a law May 17, 1900. When inquiries regarding the effects of its terms upon commutation were made, Register West informed the settlers that the price would be \$1.25 per acre instead of \$3.75. The commissioner of the general land office reversed this decision of the local land office and the matter then went to the secretary of the interior, who gave an opinion on November 23, 1900, that the rate of \$1.25 per acre would apply. Those who commuted after the free homes law passed and before it was amended in January last have been particularly fortunate, as they have saved to themselves \$2.50 per acre."—Lewiston Tribune.
