## TILLMAN EASY FOR LEW TENDLER

**FIGHT DECISIONS.**

**PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 25.**—Lew Tandler, local lightweight ace, stepped out of his class yesterday to throw punches at a welterweight at the National A. A. Johnny Tillman, Minneapolis writer, who outweighed the Logan southpaw by a matter of nine pounds, was outpointed over the eight-round route by Tandler. There was nothing exciting about the tilt. Tandler tried on many occasions to slip over a left to the chin or a right to the solar plexus with knockout intentions, but Tillman managed to keep out of range of the scutpaw's best offensive weapons.

**Brock Chased From Ring.**  
 Matt Brock of Cleveland proved no match for Willie Jackson of New York, and the referee stopped the bout in the fourth round at the Olympia yesterday. The Cleveland veteran attempted to fight Jackson with a punch that had less kick than the modern winner pie. All he did in the ten minutes or more of fighting was stand up there and tie up Jackson so that Willie could not put over a slumberland punch.

## G. CHEVROLET DIES IN AUTO RACE CRASH

### Eddie O'Donnell Dying, Helper Dead, at Los Angeles

**SPEEDWAY, LOS ANGELES, Nov. 25.**—Gaston Chevrolet, famous racing driver, and Lyall Jolla, mechanic for Eddie O'Donnell, were killed yesterday when Chevrolet's and O'Donnell's machines crashed together on the Los Angeles Speedway at the east end of the grand stand near the close of a 250-mile race.

Chevrolet's standing in the race at the time he was killed had won for him the national automobile racing championship for 1920 on a point basis. O'Donnell was so seriously injured that it was at first reported he was killed. His skull was fractured and both arms broken, and little hope was held that he could recover.

John Bressahan, Chevrolet's mechanic, was seriously injured. O'Donnell's car struck the fence on the east turn and bounded down the track, colliding with a car driven by Gaston Chevrolet.

## JACK JOHNSON LANDS KNOCKOUT

**LEAVENWORTH, Kas., Nov. 25.**—Jack Johnson, former heavyweight champion of the world, knocked out Frank Owens of Chicago in the last round of a six-round bout and then boxed "Topeka Jack" Johnson another five rounds at the federal prison here yesterday afternoon.

Regulation fighting gloves were used and the rounds were of three minutes each.

**Left Hook Ends Bout.**  
 In his bout with Owen, a 240-pound Negro, Johnson knocked his opponent down twelve times before he finally sent him to the canvas with a terrific hook to the jaw in the last round.

Before Johnson entered the ring he exhibited a bad abrasion on his right hand and it was noticeable that he seldom used that member for his hard punches. He thus explained to newspaper men after the fight his inability to finish Owens sooner.

Johnson appeared to be in good condition, and it was the opinion of ringside critics that the former champion is still a formidable fighting man.

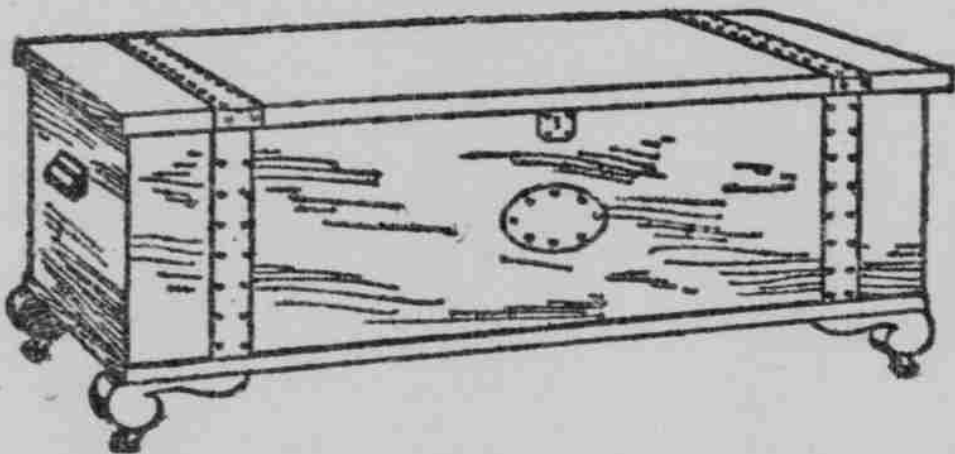

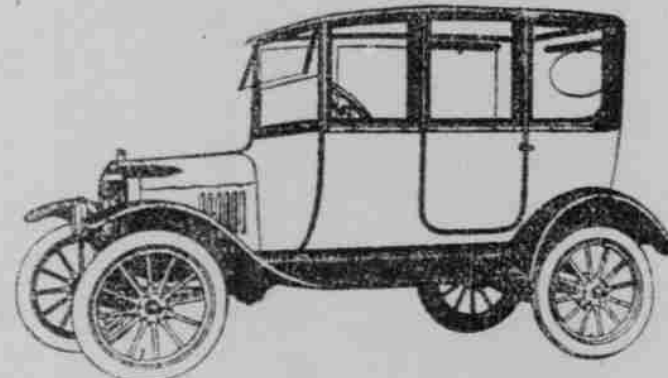

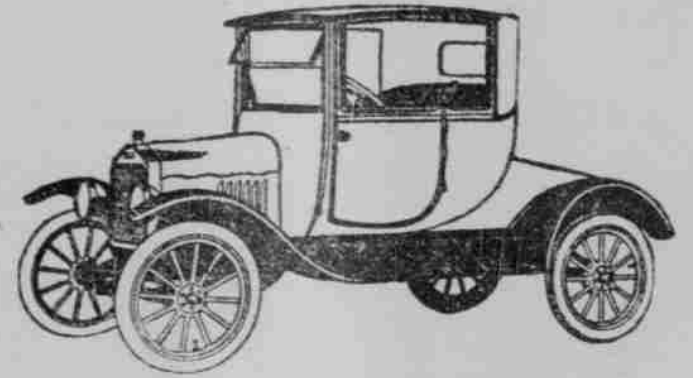
