## HAMMOND GOES DOWN IN DEFEAT

### Monster Crowd Sees Navy Boys Trim Hammond's Champions. Oh, That Disastrous Seventh Inning!

Before the biggest crowd of the season in Hammond was down to defeat yesterday at the hands of the Great Lakes Naval Training Station.

The final score was 9 to 1 and although Reynolds held the Jackies down to a one run lead for six innings, they finally overcame him in the seventh and eighth scoring two runs in each frame and putting up too big a margin for the host ball to recover.

Driscoll brushed like a scold when Reynolds' shot and then he took the long winded walk and then he was fairly coolly rebuffed by striking out "Faddy" obliged and saved him the trouble by trying to steal second. This was Johnny's second hit as he had opened up the second inning with a double over third, only to be cut down on the plate on an infield grounder. With runners on first and second Kowarski sacrificed, and then Jack Keppel the new kid first baseman, who bats and throws left handed, hit for Thompson. The monster responded with a single to left on the first pitched ball and while the hit scored because it was not quite low enough to allow Reynolds to catch all the way in from second. However, with one man out and Rhode next up it looked like a pinch that we would tie the score but the host went against Hammond and "Faddy" hit into a double play when he tied to the first baseman with Knapp on the way to second. Here was Hammond's only chance and after this rally the seventh inning was over and the crowd of the Jackies never again had a look-in as both Beach and Elberth who replaced him in the sixth looked about all the best of the way.

As for the senior lady they pitched up two minutes and a double in succession for the first time since they have had a base on balls and three singles good for another pile in the eighth.
