

PNEUMONIA TAKES A. H. STUDEBAKER

Prominent Young Man Victim of Disease Resulting From Influenza.

Arthur Harold Studabaker, son of the late Henry and Priscilla Studabaker, died at 7:15 o'clock Friday night of pneumonia. Death occurred at Mr. Studabaker's home, 522 E. Indiana av.

Ten days ago Mr. Studabaker was stricken with Spanish influenza which soon developed into pneumonia, and he grew steadily worse.

On Feb. 27, 1909, Mr. Studabaker was married to Miss Irene Cronk, who survives him. In addition to Mrs. Studabaker he is survived by the following brothers and sisters: Adelle Studabaker, Mrs. J. M. Chillas, Clem W., Peter E., and William Studabaker of this city, Mrs. A. W. Bowman of North Manchester, Ind., and Mrs. Irving Gingrich of Chicago.

DR. MAYO HERE TO SEND SERUM 'FLU' INCREASES THROUGHOUT U. S.

Famous Surgeon Promises Epidemic More Pronounced in Eastern Section of the Country, Report.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 19.—Reports to the public health service today from 35 states showed that Spanish influenza still is on the increase in most parts of the country.

CLOSING DATE SUBJECT TO EXTENSION DECLARES STATE HEALTH OFFICER

INDIANAPOLIS, Oct. 19.—In ordering an extension of the state health ban on all public gatherings in Indiana to cover another week, Dr. J. N. Hurty, secretary of the board made it clear that the new date set for the termination of the epidemic orders was only tentative and was subject to further extension if conditions next week indicate the necessity.
