

BROWN CASE TAKEN UNDER ADVISEMENT BY DAYTON COURT

GREENVILLE, Ohio, Dec. 30.—The motion of Prosecutor Hoel to strike out part of the answer in the quo warranto proceedings against County Treasurer Brown and also a motion for judgment on the pleadings was heard by the court of appeals at Dayton before Judges Allread, Ferneding and Kunkle. The court took the case under advisement.

Just before Attorney Kyle started his argument for the state, Attorney John Maher, for the defense, was granted permission by the court to file an amended answer in which will be set out the fact that Treasurer Brown already has been placed on trial and acquitted on one of the indictments.

Attorney Kyle made the opening argument for the state and was followed by Attorneys Maher and Murphy, for the defense. The closing argument was made by Prosecutor Hoel.

Judge Ferneding stated that, in view of the importance of the case, an early decision would be made.

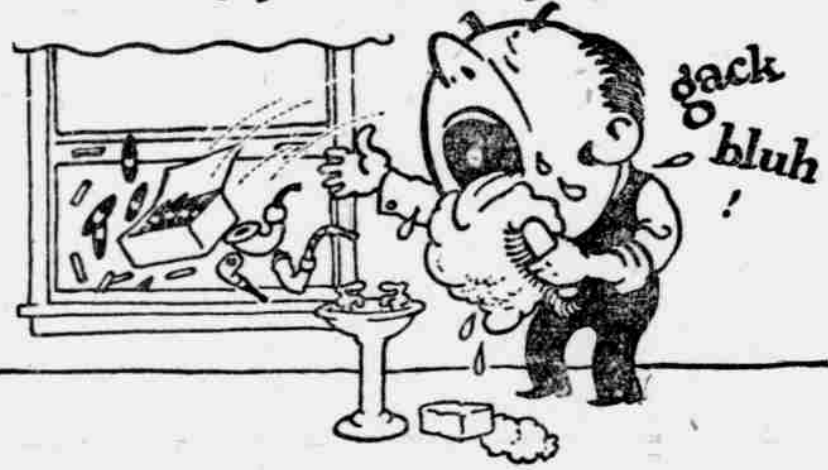

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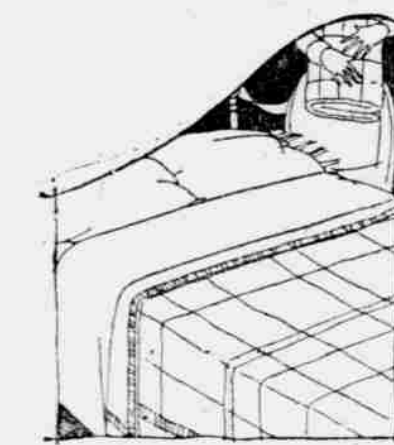
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
