

ROBBINS' CUB SCOUTS HOLD "OPEN HOUSE" IN HONOR OF NATIONAL BOY SCOUT WEEK

In observance of National Boy Scout week, the Cub Scouts of Robbins, Pack No. 247, presented its First Annual "Open House," on Friday, February 16, 1951, at the Lincoln Memorial School.

A crowd of parents, neighbors and friends were on hand to get acquainted with the Cubs; learn the aims of cubbing, and inspect various cub projects.

An impressive opening with Cub songs, with everyone participating, set the spirit for an enjoyable evening. Master of Ceremonies, Mr. Wallace Fisher, assisted the boys and the group in pledging allegiance to the flag, after which the speakers were introduced. Commissioner Ernest Young, who spoke on "Cubbing Today," stressed the fact that cubbing needed the firm and sincere support of parents, since cubbing is primarily a home project.

A thorough explanation of how the Scout Executive boards plan and prepare programs for the boys was outlined by Mr. Russell Walton, Field Executive of the Pokagon Trails District. "All our efforts are directed towards the boy. He is the most important factor in the Scout movement," said Mr. Walton.

Highlights of the program, however, were the various projects the boys in each den had made. Under

the direct tutelage of Den Mothers, Mrs. Frances Young and Mrs. Roy Brown, the boys showed adeptness at making soap carvings, model airplanes, cigar box banjos, pictures and mechanical toys. Of particular interest were a drum made from an old nail keg, and a xylophone made of assorted bottles, mounted on a wooden platform.

More Cub songs, questions by parents, refreshments, and taps by the Cubs rounded out the evening. Particular credit must be given the boys and Den Mothers for their fine cooperation in making the night such a successful one. One couldn't help but feel, however, that the boys would progress much faster and ably if more parents, friends, and civic organizations took more direct interest in them. Nevertheless, the boys are looking forward to next year's "Open House," and hope to see a crowd twice as large.
