BURGLAR NABBED IN ACT!

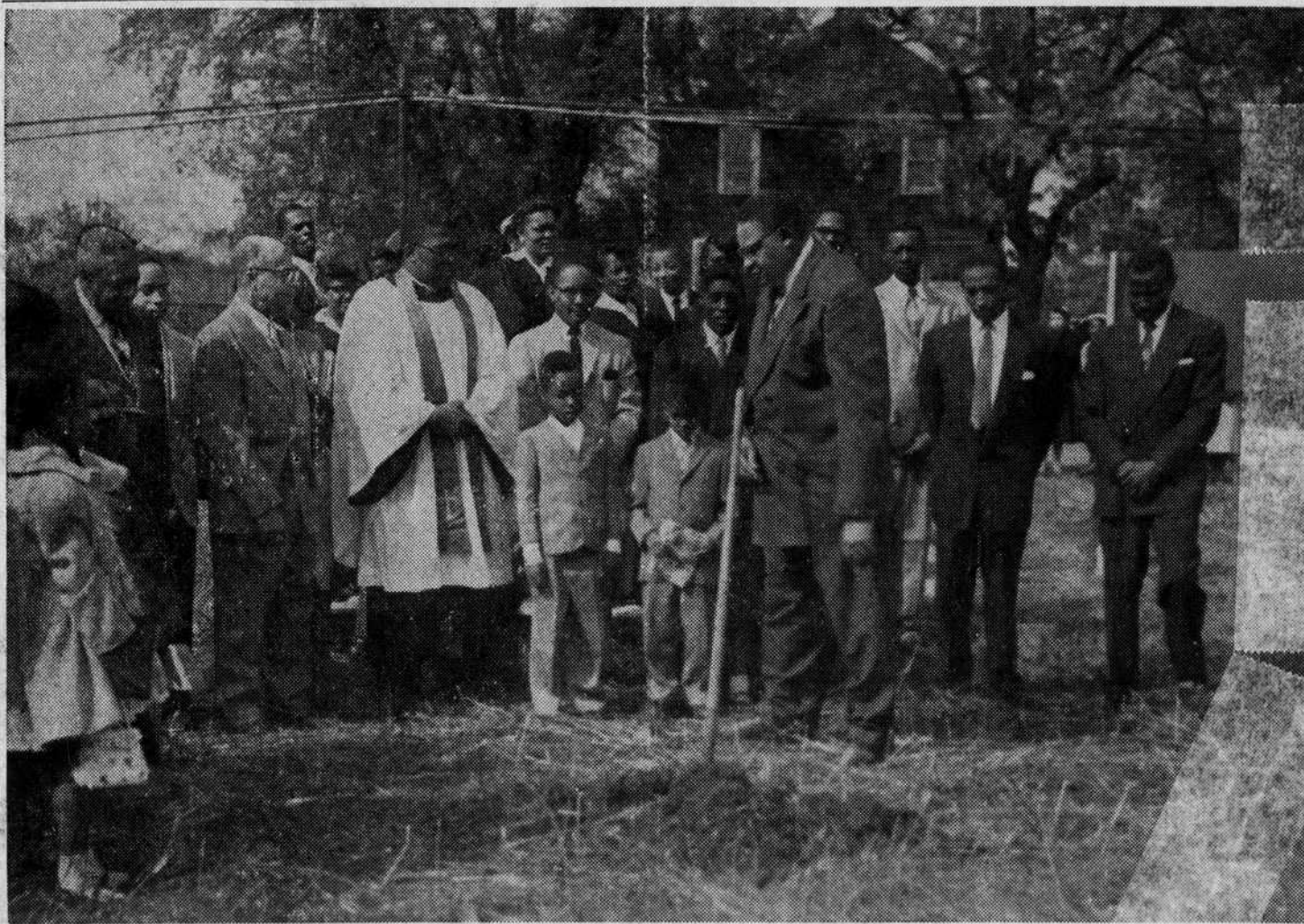
The Blue Island police were on routine patrol Sunday night, October 6 about 11:30 p.m., when they were hailed by a citizen who reported that a gun shot was heard nearby. They immediately investigated and found two men struggling in Neldon's gun shop at 12358 South Western avenue. Coming closer the po-

lice found them to be the owner of the shop, Frank Neldon and Carlos V. Lindsey, jr., 21, of 13635 Monticello ave., Robbins. Lindsey, who had gained entrance to the shop by breaking a window, was surprised by the owner who grabbed Lindsey before he could get out of the shop
