## X-RAYS GIVEN IN AUGUST

Some 1,500 persons in the Champaign-Urbana area were X-rayed at the Chest Clinic during August, the Champaign County Tuberculosis Association announced Saturday.

This figure brings the total number of persons X-rayed since the beginning of the year to 6,277.

The association reports that during August "self-referrals" numbered 479 and patients re-

ferred by family physicians totaled 207. Others had X-rays to meet the Illinois law which requires all school employees to have a TB examination each year.

The TB case rate for Champaign County over a five-year period ending in 1961 was 12.9. This rate is considerably lower than the rates in nearby counties for the same period, according to the association.

Other county rates include Macon, 26; McLean, 16.4; Vermillion, 31.6; and Sangamon, 24.4.

The clinic is open Monday through Friday from 1 to 4 p. m., Tuesday from 7 to 9 p. m. and Saturday from 9 to 11 a. m.

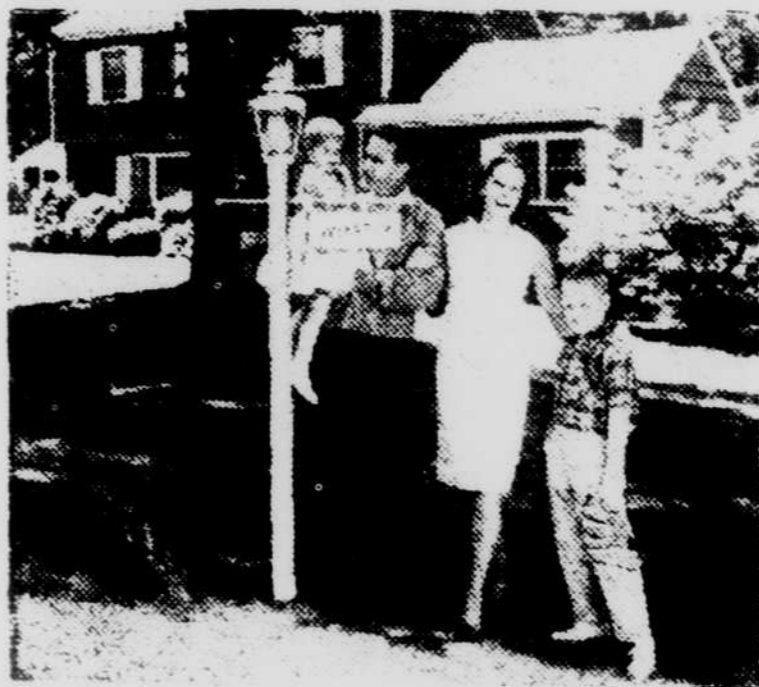

## Mellon Tells

The complexity of the teaching profession is described by E. H. Mellon, superintendent of Champaign Unit 4 schools, in an article entitled "Our Growing Profession" in the September issue of Illinois Education.

It is Mellon's contention in the article that the teaching profession "no longer consists of mere presentation of facts — important as this is — but is involved in the highly skilled application of psychology and teaching methodology."

He writes that a profession — in this instance teaching — operates under four criteria: it renders a service to society based on special knowledge; is represented by a voluntary organization, not allied with economic, political or religious groups, which seeks ways to improve the quality of its service as well as the welfare of its members; protects its competent from unjust attacks and protects the public from incompetency, and is governed by a single code of ethics.

Mellon said that such organizations as the National Education Association tend to uplift the teaching profession, and he urges teachers in Illinois to join the NEA.

"Teachers should avail themselves of the opportunity to join NEA," he says, "because this type of cooperation... can only lead to one end — the upgrading of the educational process."
