

GIANTS WIN 2; THEN LOSE 2 TO DODGERS

Chicago Takes First of Series with B'klyn; Dodgers Take Sunday Double

Powell Forced to Relieve Brown in First Inning; Giants Return Saturday

Brooklyn, N. Y., May 29—The Brooklyn Dodgers, by taking both ends of a double-header Sunday, split even with the Chicago American Giants in their four-game series.

The first game of the double-header was a hard fought game with the Dodgers coming from behind in the final two innings to win out by the score of 6 to 5.

The Giants got off to an early lead in the second inning with one run and came back in the third to score two more, only to have Brooklyn tie the count in their half with three runs. This included one scoring until the first of the seventh, when the Giants scored one run, taking the lead.

The Giants scored one more in the eighth to make things apparently safe, but the Dodgers tied up the count with two runs in their half of the ninth and coming back in the last of the tenth after holding the Giants in their half, with the deciding run.

In the first inning of the first game, the Dodgers made sure of a win with nine runs off the pitching of Brown, a recruit pitcher, and Powell, who relieved him.

This game was one of those free-for-all hitting games, with the Dodgers doing all the hitting and scoring, getting 14 runs and 17 hits, against 6 hits and 4 runs for the Giants.

The Giants will be home Saturday for a long stay and should regain the ground they lost while on the road.
