Market Reports.

NEW YORK, Sept. 15. - It is believed that Hall does not intend to impeach Connelly. The list of abstracted vouchers will be out in a day or two, they were given by Messrs. Ingersoll, Keyser, Smith, Miller, and other ring contractors for alleged work done for Hoffman. It is reported to expend Messrs. Hall, Connelly, Sweeney and Tweed pending the investigation of the charges against them, and to put them to the fullest extent of the law if they are found guilty.

A secret consultation was held yesterday in connection with the proposed amendment of the Constitution of the State of New York, for the purpose of devising some means to secure the displacement of Comptroller Connelly. The result of the consultation is not known.

No one whatever has yet been had to do with the theft of the vouchers from the Comptroller's office. Comptroller Connelly, while disclaiming all knowledge of the abstraction, has suspicions which he says are distinct and break at present, but which the public would have very soon, and which would entirely exonerate him.

Judge Barnard adjourned over till tomorrow at the conclusion of the argument of Beach, counsel for the Comptroller. An explosion occurred shortly before 2 o'clock this afternoon, in the Union Torpedo Works, near Fulton Market, killing six persons instantly, and wounding eight or more.

The government sold to-day four millions of gold, instead of two millions, as advertised, from 115.75 to 114.00.

The Hon. O'Brien issued a circular calling for a secret meeting at Apollo Hall tonight, for the purpose of organizing a Democratic anti-Tammany party. Among those invited were Judge Ledwith, Joseph Blumenthal, T. U. Olney, L. Waish, Congressman Roosevelt and Judge Barnard. Only the two last mentioned accepted the invitation. A very few attended the meeting, the proceedings of which were secret.

SARATOGA, Sept. 14. - A fire to-day destroyed property to the amount of nearly \$200,000. Park Place Hotel, Columbia Hotel, and a large part of the Crescent were destroyed, with many other buildings. Incendiarism is believed to be the cause.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14. - It is responsible upon the Treasury department not to have discovered Major Hodge's defalcation sooner. The actual amount of Hodge's deficit is \$473,939.

In his letter of confession he refers to parties of this city and one in New York, through whose agencies he has made speculations. The parties in this city, he declares, are perfectly innocent of any knowledge that he was using in his operations the public funds. The party in New York, he states, knew the money lost with them was public money and not his own. Hodge caused to be communicated to the following: Middleston & Co., bankers, Washington; and Pelham & Jackson, bankers, No. 66, Exchange Place, New York city.

QUINCY, Ill., Sept. 14. - The first passenger train that has yet passed over the completed portion of the Quincy, Alton & St. Louis railroad, left here this afternoon with the excursion party, consisting of the County Superintendant, railroad officials and members of the press. The road is completed twenty miles, and connects with the Hannibal & Chicago, Alton & St. Louis road had purchased this, but as yet no transfer has been made, and the probabilities are that the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy railroad will be completed.
