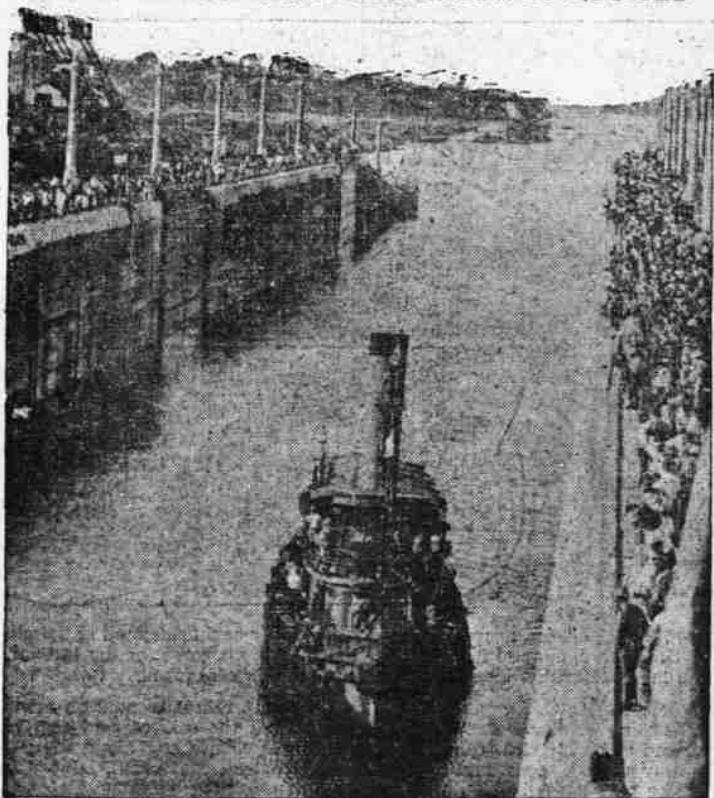


FIRST SHIP THROUGH THE PANAMA CANAL LOCK—A TUG—BUT HERE'S HOW IT LOOKED



The tug-boat "Gatun," commanded by Capt. F. S. Stewart, and carrying a party of notables, in the presence of thousands gathered on either wall of the locks, passed through Gatun locks, from the Atlantic ocean to Gatun Lake, after it had been lifted from the sea level to the level of Gatun Lake. The "Gatun" entered the lower locks without a single hitch, steaming out into Gatun Lake, less than two hours later. This is the first vessel to pass through the Gatun locks. Col. George Goethals, the chief builder of the canal, didn't make the trip. He just looked on.
