## MONSTER STRIKEBREAKING AGENCY IS EXPOSED BY LETTER

*Correspondence Signed by Archibald Mahon of the  
Waddell-Mahon Corporation of Strikebreakers  
Offers Assistance in Case of Trouble at Wichita  
Falls—Gives Interesting References.*

The Day Book has unearthed absolute evidence of the gigantic, nation-wide conspiracy to destroy union labor, through the medium of a national army of strikebreakers in charge of the Waddell-Mahon corporation.

A letter, signed by Archibald Mahon, treasurer of the Waddell-Mahon corporation, is now in possession of the International Brotherhood of Blacksmiths' and Boilermakers' Union. It came into their possession during their recent convention in Sedalia, Mo.

The letter is an offer to break a strike. It points with pride to the several strikes in which their guards have managed to destroy union labor in various plants throughout the country and install non-union or open shops.

The methods of the Waddell-Mahon gunmen are well-known to those who have followed the course of the Calumet mine strike, where they have beaten down men, women and children.

The letter warns of the approach of a crisis in industrial affairs of the United States. And, according to their letter, theirs is the only practical way in which to forestall the inevitable.
