BANDITS REAP HARVEST

While Chicago's police force was busy last night "protecting" trust newspapers, and assisting in distribution of those sheets, a score of robberies were reported by citizens to various police stations. No arrests were made.

Three bandits held up citizens in the doorways of their homes.

The three men rang the bell at the home of F. C. Powers, 5050 Forestville avenue. When Powers opened the door they covered him with a revolver and took his watch, stickpin and money. Loss was \$125.

Charles Stevens was next. He was held up as he was entering his home, 4421 Greenwood avenue. A watch valued at \$50, diamond pin worth \$40 and \$45 in cash was taken.

One robber, working by himself, stuck up three cafes in 30 minutes, collected \$100 in loot.

He took \$40 from George Fritz, 4071 Elston avenue, and when the saloonkeeper followed him, the robber drew a gun and shot his victim.

After taking some money from Frank Latta, whose saloon is at 3932 Elston avenue, the locked Latta in the icebox,

Charles Bruech, 4201 Elston avenue, was visited, but refused to pay toll, and chased the man from the place with a knife.

HANNON DIES OF WOUND.

Patrick Hannon of the Freight Handlers' Union, who, with Geo. Weisling, was shot by John Deluca, a strikebreaker in the employ of the Burlington, Saturday night, died of his wounds.

The funeral of Hannon will be held tomorrow. Every one of the 4,000 members of the Freight Handlers' Union will attend it.

Weisling's funeral, which was held Tuesday, was one of the most impressive ever held in Chicago.

Hannon's home was at 2932 Harvard street.

Deluca is held at the Maxwell Street Police Station.
