"Every public officer must enforce the law whether a man or a woman is guilty. Dr. Booth did not stand well in this community. He himself should have been indicted in this court three years ago. But he wasn't."

(The court referred to the death of Mrs. Booth No. 1, and the marriage of Dr. Booth to the woman now accused fifteen days later.)

"That was one lapse of the law. It is no reason for another. By our tolerance for the crimes of women we are cultivating a disrespect of the law. The worst crimes in the history of the world were committed by women."

Dundee, Jan. 30.—Just as the mayor was extending the freedom of the city o Prime Minister Asquith today a band of militant suffragettes stormed the hall.

The women shouted "traitor" and "coward" as they charged down on the prime minister. Police and men in the audience prevented them reaching him.

One suffragette climbed over the balcony rail and was going to jump down on the heads of those below when a man dragged her back. All of the women were roughly handled.

London, Jan. 30.—The national convention of the Labor Party by a vote of 850 to 437 today instructed all labor members of

Parliament to oppose any franchise reform bill which did not include votes for women, regardless of any alliance now existing between the Labor Party and the Liberals.

The Suffragette, the votes for women publication, edited by Cristabel Pankhurst, for whom all Scotland Yard is hunting, today says:

"The issue depends solely on the women. Unless they are prepared to pay the price they cannot expect any help from the men. Militancy is the only weapon left us. Its possibilities are far from exhausted."

The guerilla warfare of the militants was carried on today. Letter boxes were tampered with in every quarter of London. In many places the women used an acid that caused the contents of the boxes to take fire.

"Bashibazoukesses" is the latest slang term for the militants under the leadership of "General" Mrs. Drummond.

It is believed here that the women intend to carry their methods further than ever in the immediate future, and that they will not hesitate at assassination if necessary to get the ballot.

Mrs. Deppard, sister of General Sir John French, was the maddest woman in London last night when some unknown sympathizer paid her fine of \$10 and she was released from prison.
