

JUDGE URGES CONVICTION OF SOUTHERN BEAUTY—
SAYS "TREAT WOMAN MURDERER JUST LIKE A MAN"

Lake Providence, La., Feb. 8.
—When Mrs. Clarice Nelson Booth is placed on trial for nearly blowing off her husband's head with a shotgun, it will be "southern chivalry" on trial, more than the accused woman.

Judge F. I. Ransdell had to give the grand jury some mighty, straight-from-the-shoulder talk before they would indict the pretty young woman for killing her husband, Dr. James Fleet Booth, Jan. 23.

"I know," he said, "that men
