Many of the conditions under which the disease develops may be remedied by increasing the knowledge of cancer. Campaigns of education have as their object the spreading of information about the disease. The American Society for the Control of Cancer has recently been formed to encourage and direct this kind of educational activity. The society plans to cooperate with all existing agencies engaged in studying the disease, and to publish in every city, town and cillage the message of hope which lies in the early recognition and proper treatment of cancer.
