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## STOP-LOOK-LISTENERS IN POLITICAL DEATH-FIGHT WITH 'SEVEN SISTERS'

*Ballot War Waged In Pacific Northwest by Big Business  
and Standpatters to Defeat Seven Bills En-  
dorsed by Labor and Farmers.*

Seattle, Wash., July 10.—A battle royal, precipitated by the "Seven Sisters," is being waged in the State of Washington. The November election will determine the winner.

The "Seven Sisters" are seven initiative bills proposed by a joint committee representing the State Federation of Labor, the State Grange, the Farmers' Union, and the Direct Legislation League of Washington. The nickname was given the bills by the standpatters who are fighting them, but the backers of the

initiative measures were favorably impressed with the name and gladly adopted it themselves.

These bills provide the following:

1. Amendment of the workmen's compensation act to provide "first aid" for injured. This means that when a worker is hurt, the employer is required to furnish hospital and medical treatment up to an amount of \$100, in addition to paying into the state industrial insurance fund a regular monthly contribution to compensate workmen for injuries sustained.
