ANOTHER BLOW TO LIQUOR SALES.

Los Angeles seems to be going in for novel liquor regulations. A recent news item reports that the police commission, under leadership of the mayor, has put into effect a rule providing that hereafter no civilian can be served with intoxicating drinks in any liquor establishments...

This ruling was found necessary because civilians were buying drinks and passing them on to uniformed men, thus technically evading the prohibition against selling intoxicants to soldiers or sailors.

It is further explained that any act that may be construed as a subterfuge to violate this resolution will be cause for the revocation of a license.

It is safe to prophesy that a uniform darkening of the entrance to any place where liquor is ordinarily sold will be welcomed with tempered joy by all but "bone-dry" enthusiasts. It might be a good prohibition move to station a soldier or sailor in every liquor-dispensing place and thus effectively stop all liquor sales.

NEXT LIBERTY LOAN NOT TO BE FOR EIGHT BILLION, SAYS MC ADOO

Washington, Dec. 21.—Emphatic denial that the next Liberty Loan will be for eight billion dollars at 4 1/2 per cent. was made today by Secretary of the Treasury McAdoo in the following statement:

"The report that the next issue of the Liberty Bonds would be \$8,000,000,000 and at 4 1/2 per cent. is wholly unfounded. I wish I could make the patriotic newspapermen of America realize how mischievous and harmful to the interests of the country, such circulated statements are. When a decision has been reached about the next Liberty Loan, it will be officially announced. Meanwhile all other statements and rumors may be disregarded."
