WILL U. S. OUST THUGS OF RICH CLASS?

*Progressive Industrial Relation Commission Will Insist
Upon Congress Doing Away With Capitalistic
Thugs and Gunmen—Split May Be Solved.*

Will the United States government abolish private armies in this country?

Will the industrial relations commission recommend drastic action against the maintenance of armed guards by "trustified" industries, who, by bloody reign of terror and death in time of labor troubles, rob the workingman of even the right to protest?

Will the commission, in its forthcoming report recommend that congress enact laws forbidding the transportation from state to state of the

"armies" supplied by detective agencies and industrial protection corporations?

Will they recommend that arsenals maintained by huge corporations be abolished — arsenals stocked with guns, cartridges and clubs enough in many cases to arm a force sufficient to subdue state militia?

These, it is believed, are the steps that the progressive faction of the commission will recommend and fight for if the war now raging behind closed doors continues. The "progressives"—the ones fighting for the red-hot Manly report—are Chairman Frank P. Walsh and James
