**BIRTH CONTROL IS AIM
OF NEW LEAGUE**

**Men and Women Organize Society To Aid "Family
Limitation" Movement—Wm. Sanger To Be Tried
For Giving Pamphlet on Birth Control.**

New York, May 12.—As a result of the arrest of William Sanger, architect, for giving to an agent of Anthony Comstock the pamphlet on birth control (written by Sanger's wife, Margaret, "The Woman Rebel," a group of New York men and women, composed of teachers, writers, doctors, have rallied to the defense of the Sangers and have just formed themselves into the Birth Control league.

The purpose of this organization, according to its members, is "to create an intelligent public demand for the repeal of all laws prohibiting the giving out of information concerning methods of birth-control. And the league plans to distribute such in-

formation after it has become legal to do so.

In this respect it differs from Mrs. Sanger, a trained nurse, whose work brought her in contact with the sufferings of poor mothers of too many children and who desolved to defy the law, which she maintains is a dead letter for the rich, by distributing a leaflet on family limitation to all who asked for it. She distributed more than 100,000 of these pamphlets before her arrest, it is said, and being released without ball, fled to Europe, where she is now.

After her flight an agent of Anthony Comstock, who had prosecuted her, called at the home of William Sanger, architect, who had nothing to do with his wife's propaganda, persuaded the young man to go through
