## HALF OF INDIANA CITY RAZED BY CYCLONE --FIND 26 BODIES

**Twister Lasts Less Than Minute, but Did Million  
Dollars' Damage, Destroyed 500 Homes and Killed  
Scores at Newcastle, Ind.—Cincinnati Suffers.**

Newcastle, Ind.—26 dead, 20  
missing, 150 injured, 500 homes  
destroyed.

Newcastle, Ind., March 12.—With  
26 bodies already recovered, search  
continued today for further dead in  
wake of cyclone which swept down  
on this city late yesterday, destroy-  
ing 500 homes and causing property

damage of more than a million dol-  
lars. Estimates were that from 10  
to 20 bodies were still in the ruins.

Manufacturing plants were closed  
while workmen aided three compa-  
nies of militia and 100 special police-  
men in keeping guard and cleaning  
up debris, strewn over a cyclone-  
swept district two and a half miles  
wide and 15 miles long, through the  
residence district of the city and on  
into a prosperous farming country.

J. Lebb Watkins, mayor, lost ev-  
erything but his clothes. His home  
was destroyed and his pocketbook,  
containing \$205, was blow away.
