LAMBERTS TO BE ASKED TO TESTIFY FOR ORPET

Waukegan, Ill., May 25.—The task of selecting a jury to try Orpet for Marion Lambert murder dragged on slowly in 10th day of trial. 626 men had been questioned and examined for jury service when court opened today and only four jurors, the first panel, permanently accepted.

Although Judge Chas. M. Donnelly, piqued by distorted publicity given trial, had imposed ban of silence on defense and state, it was learned today that defense has summoned as witnesses most of those also summoned by the state.

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Lambert, parents of Marion, will be asked to testify for Orpet.
