Washington, Aug. 18.—The administration bill, giving the war finance corporation authority to extend \$500,000,000 credits to the railroads was ordered favorably reported by the senate interstate commerce committee yesterday by a vote of 7 to 2.

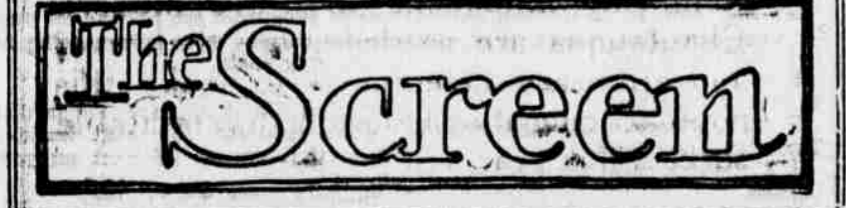
