ORDINANCE NO. 13. OF STREETS AND THE STREET SUPERVISOR. Be it ordained by the city council of the city of Cairo.

SEC. 1. For the purpose of keeping the streets and avenues in repair, every male inhabitant of said city, between the ages of twenty and fifty years, shall be and they are hereby required to labor on the streets and avenues of the city three days in each year, under direction of such officer as the city council may direct.

SEC. 2. There shall be appointed by the city council an officer of the city, to be called supervisor of streets, who shall be and he is hereby required to attend to the collection of the street tax, and such other duties as may be devolved upon him by the city council.

SEC. 3. Before any street supervisor shall enter upon the duties of his office, he shall take an oath of office as provided for other officers, and shall enter into bonds for \$2,000 with sufficient security to be approved by the city council.

SEC. 4. The city clerk shall provide blank receipt books, the receipts in which shall be numbered with corresponding numbers on slips or margins, and shall deliver one book at a time to such supervisor, who shall use the receipts contained in said book and no other in his collections of street tax, and when a receipt is issued by said supervisor for street tax, he shall enter in the margin of said book, corresponding with the receipt, the name of the person to whom said receipt was issued and the date and amount thereof.

SEC. 5. The supervisor shall be charged with, and account to the city for all the receipts furnished him as herein provided, and in case of his refusal or neglect to return an account for such receipts, the amounts collected to the city council convened in joint session at each regular meeting of the same, on the first Monday of each and every month, by producing the receipts of the treasurer and the report of the city clerk, he shall forfeit and pay to said city a sum not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than fifty dollars.

keep a list of the persons notified, the date of his notification, and the amount paid in lieu of labor, and by whom; and to all persons who shall be notified, he shall give a receipt, and if he fails to do so, he shall be liable for the street tax of that year.

SEC. 11. All persons laboring on the streets shall be required to labor each day, reasonable diligence being used, in each day, in conformity with the notice aforesaid, shall refuse to execute work in the manner directed by the Street committee or person in charge, he shall not be entitled to receive any credit for street tax, but shall be reported to the city council for prosecution as one of those failing or refusing to work.

SEC. 12. If any person who neglected or refused to labor on the streets, after being notified as aforesaid, shall fail to pay to the supervisor of streets or the city treasurer the sum of three dollars, in the legal currency of the United States, on or before the last day on which he was required to labor as above specified, he shall be liable to the city in an action for the recovery thereof; and the supervisor of streets shall, immediately upon the expiration of the three days during which labor was to be performed, furnish a list of all such delinquent persons to the city attorney, who shall thereupon institute suit against such delinquents for the respective amounts due them, provided, if any person from whom street labor can be required shall before notice to attend for labor shall have been given to him, as hereinbefore provided, pay to said street supervisor the sum of two dollars in legal currency of the United States, and be entitled to receive, and the said street supervisor is hereby authorized and instructed to give him a receipt in full for street labor for the current year said money to be paid into the City Treasury as now provided by Section 53 of this ordinance.

SEC. 13. All moneys received by the supervisor of streets in lieu of street labor, into the city treasury, on or before the first Monday of each month; and at each monthly stated meeting of the city council said supervisor shall make report of his receipts and expenditures, and work or cause to be removed any earth from any of the avenues or streets of the city, or remove earth from one part of a street to another, or public grounds within the corporate limits of the city of Cairo, without having first obtained leave from the city council to do so; and every person or persons or body corporate offending against the provisions of this ordinance, shall be liable to the city of Cairo a sum not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars for each and every offense; provided, the hauling and carrying away of each load and each parcel, and each other separate removal of earth, shall be considered and taken as a distinct and separate offense.

SEC. 14. It shall not be lawful for any person to place or deposit on any of the streets or avenues of the city, so as to obstruct the same, any timber, wood, lumber, coal, brick, stone, or other materials; and every person violating the provisions of this section shall forfeit and pay, for the use of the city, a sum not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars, for each and every offense; provided, builders may occupy half the street with freight while so engaged.

SEC. 15. It shall be the duty of the police constables, or other police officer on duty in day-time, to observe infractions of this ordinance and to notify the proper parties to remove the obstructions on the streets or avenues. If said obstructions are not removed within twenty-four hours after notice, the city council shall be and they are hereby authorized to remove the same to some convenient place, and to require the owner or owners, or person who placed or deposited the obstructions, to pay the expense of said removal. If such person cannot be found, or if he fails to pay the same, it shall be the duty of said police constables, or other officer, to remove, or cause to be removed, the same to some convenient place, and to require the owner or owners, or person who placed or deposited the obstructions, to pay the expense of said removal.

SEC. 16. Before any street supervisor shall enter upon the duties of his office, he shall take an oath of office as provided for other officers, and shall enter into bonds for \$2,000 with sufficient security to be approved by the city council convened in joint session for the faithful performance of the duties of his office as such supervisor.

SEC. 17. The city clerk shall provide blank receipt books, the receipts in which shall be numbered with corresponding numbers on slips or margins, and shall deliver one book at a time to such supervisor, who shall use the receipts contained in said book and no other in his collections of street tax, and when a receipt is issued by said supervisor for street tax, he shall enter in the margin of said book, corresponding with the receipt, the name of the person to whom said receipt was issued and the date and amount thereof.

SEC. 18. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to place or deposit, or cause to be placed or deposited, on any of the streets or avenues of the city, any of the wastes or refuse of the city, or any decayed vegetable or animal matter, or any matter of offensive odor, or any other person or persons violating the provisions of this section, shall forfeit and pay to the city a sum not less than ten dollars, nor more than fifty dollars for each and every offense.

SEC. 19. It shall not be lawful for any person to deposit upon the sidewalk, upon Levee street, materials of any description which will obstruct the passage of vehicles, to a greater width than eight feet; nor shall any dry wagon, or other vehicle, be engaged in loading or unloading for a greater length of time than ten minutes; and every person violating either of the provisions of the preceding section, shall forfeit and pay not less than three dollars nor more than five dollars.

SEC. 20. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to erect and maintain, or keep, or cause to be erected, maintained or kept, any showcase, stand, table, or structure, for the purpose of selling fruits, candies, nuts, cigars, cutlery, provisions, or merchandise, on any of the streets or avenues of the city of Cairo; and every person or persons violating either of the provisions of the preceding section, shall forfeit and pay not less than three dollars nor more than five dollars.

SEC. 21. That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to erect and maintain, or keep, or cause to be erected, maintained or kept, any showcase, stand, table, or structure, for the purpose of selling fruits, candies, nuts, cigars, cutlery, provisions, or merchandise, on any of the streets or avenues of the city of Cairo; and every person or persons violating either of the provisions of the preceding section, shall forfeit and pay not less than three dollars nor more than five dollars.

SEC. 22. That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to erect and maintain, or keep, or cause to be erected, maintained or kept, any showcase, stand, table, or structure, for the purpose of selling fruits, candies, nuts, cigars, cutlery, provisions, or merchandise, on any of the streets or avenues of the city of Cairo; and every person or persons violating either of the provisions of the preceding section, shall forfeit and pay not less than three dollars nor more than five dollars.

SEC. 23. That if any driver, owner or person having the ordering or superintendence of any cart, dray, wagon, stage, hearse, coach, or other carriage or vehicle, shall suffer the same to be and remain in or upon any street or alley in the City of Cairo for more than one hour after the same has been placed in or upon such street or alley, except by the order and command of the city council, or the person owning or having the ordering or superintendence of such carriage, cart, dray, wagon, stage, hearse, coach, omnibus or other vehicle so suffered to remain in any street or alley of said city, shall forfeit and pay to the city a sum not less than three nor more than twenty dollars for each and every offense.

SEC. 24. That if any driver, owner or person having the ordering or superintendence of any cart, dray, wagon, stage, hearse, coach, or other carriage or vehicle, shall suffer the same to be and remain in or upon any street or alley in the City of Cairo for more than one hour after the same has been placed in or upon such street or alley, except by the order and command of the city council, or the person owning or having the ordering or superintendence of such carriage, cart, dray, wagon, stage, hearse, coach, omnibus or other vehicle so suffered to remain in any street or alley of said city, shall forfeit and pay to the city a sum not less than three nor more than twenty dollars for each and every offense.

SEC. 25. That if any driver, owner or person having the ordering or superintendence of any cart, dray, wagon, stage, hearse, coach, or other carriage or vehicle, shall suffer the same to be and remain in or upon any street or alley in the City of Cairo for more than one hour after the same has been placed in or upon such street or alley, except by the order and command of the city council, or the person owning or having the ordering or superintendence of such carriage, cart, dray, wagon, stage, hearse, coach, omnibus or other vehicle so suffered to remain in any street or alley of said city, shall forfeit and pay to the city a sum not less than three nor more than twenty dollars for each and every offense.

SEC. 26. Be it ordained by the city council of the city of Cairo, Illinois, that the seal of the city of Cairo, Illinois, and the figures "1857" in the exterior circle, and the word "SEAL" in the center, surrounded by an appropriate vignette, representing the corn and other rich products of [Egypt] Southern Illinois, shall be used as such seal in all cases that have been or shall hereafter be provided for by law or the ordinances of the city, and in all other cases in which by law and custom it is usual and necessary for the corporation to use a seal.
