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GUARDS ARE BUSY

War Between Topeka Home Soldiers Stirs Recruiting.

Hargis-Humphreys Battle Now Waits for Reinforcements.

BOLMAR HAS NUT TO CRACK

Recorder for Organization Now Wants To Resign.

Five Bosses—Hargis, Humphreys, House, Norton, Wilson.

Calm reigned on all fronts of the Topeka home guard struggle today and only the occasional sputter of a shell that failed to explode Tuesday smoked up the atmosphere. Whether the calm was only the usual quietness that precedes a big thrust or whether the worst of the scrap is really over are matters that a powerful public, passionately interested in the matter, must wait for time alone to determine. All appearances indicate that Captain Hargis, leader of Company A, will accept whatever challenge Captain Hamlin and Commander Humphreys wish to issue and that he will stick to his post and not give up his sword until his last man is gone. It was reported Tuesday night that he was out full regalia at the regular weekly drill Tuesday night and that he had a much larger turnout than on any night in several weeks. One report stated that between thirty-five and forty men answered to roll call, and all present were accounted for. Make Competition Keen. When this report was received at other headquarters a statement was given out to the effect that "all is well on both sides of the 'Kaz'" and that the two companies undoubtedly will continue in existence and that the rivalry between them to excel in numbers and efficiency will give Topeka the best home guard army in the state. Col. Jonathan D. Norton, head of the home guard organization of Kansas, gave out a statement from his headquarters today in which he said he heartily approves the organization of a new company and that he sees no reason why two companies cannot be maintained here. However, Colonel Norton also says that no papers have been issued legalizing the new company and he is of the opinion that Commander Humphreys is not yet really a commander, some steps not yet having been taken to clothe him with the authority to officiate as such. However, Colonel Norton says he believes these steps will eventually be taken. "I see no objection to the organization of a new company," Colonel Norton said. "If the two are organized to form a guard organization cannot get along together, I believe it is best for them to separate." No Rival Recruiting Station. One new development today was the announcement of H. A. Goodrich, of the Waggoner & Goodrich store, that his place of business will not be used as a recruiting station for the new home guard company. SHOWS UP GERMAN "PEACE"

Reveals Kaiser Alone Bases Aim on Annexation.

Labor Party Has Major Power in England Now.

Washington, Jan. 17.—The British labor party's peace appeal to Russia and Germany was regarded in many quarters today as one of the most compelling and significant moves undertaken in the political offensive against Teuton militarism. It was considered a telling stroke by the most prominent new in any population—the labor group. Sweeping aside the Russian thought that Britain has tended to abandon her, the appeal was regarded as showing a real fraternity between the laborer of Britain and of Russia and of Germany. It served, as experts saw it, to point out further the duplicity and treachery of the German Brest-Litovsk negotiators while it held out the hope to Germany that she would regain her African colonies. Include India and Ireland. Manifestly born of war-weariness, the appeal, however, was regarded as showing a firm and loyal determination on the part of labor to "see it thru," even to the point of national ship, insurance and things seem to be in a rather hopeless tangle, which makes my position rather unpleasant, but I do not know whether to tender my resignation to Hargis, Humphreys, Mayor House, Colonel Norton, President Wilson, or to the men who elected me."

JURY CHAIRS BURNED

Garden City, Kan., Jan. 17.—A wooden spittoon box filled with sawdust and a cigar stub caused a thousand dollar fire in Finney county court house. A night session of court was held till 10:30 o'clock Tuesday night, and about 3 in the morning fire was discovered in the courtroom. The fire department was soon on the ground and the fire put out, but not until the jury box and chairs were entirely consumed and the courtroom badly damaged by fire, smoke and water. The room occupied by the county superintendent of public instruction being directly under the courtroom was badly damaged by water. The office rooms were all damaged more or less but not enough to prevent business being conducted in them today.

GIRLS BEAT 'EM UP

Attack Conductor and Motorman When Ordered to V. Ik.

Pittsburg, Pa., Jan. 17.—Seven girls ordered to leave a trolley when it was half a mile from the point to which they had paid their fare followed a mob and clubbed the trolley conductor and motorman. The disorder occurred on the Homewood line, near Homestead. The girls were beaten and thrown from the car. The girls they attacked the motorman. Other trolley men went to his rescue and police threatened the girls with arrest. Under police guard the car was run to the barn.
