Grange News.

The number of subordinate Granges now in Virginia is 378, with ten Pomona Granges.

Patrons of Butler county, Ohio, have a supply store with \$10,000 capital.

The amount saved to Patrons, through the Missouri State Agency, in the last six months, is: On sewing machines, \$8,822; corn planters, \$1,137; cultivators, \$1,533; mowers and reapers, \$7,336; grain drills, \$480; groceries, etc., \$8,600; total, \$36,508.

The chairman of the National Grange Executive Committee reports that there is \$62,256.33 invested in Government bonds, worth now about \$70,000 in greenbacks; \$9,747.54 stands to the credit of States that have not drawn their \$250 for each subordinate Grange; deducting this leaves the net assets in the treasury, \$56,678.18.

The Master of the Indiana State Grange says: "A large majority of the Granges in most of the counties report themselves in good working order, and increasing in membership of a better class than some they have lost."

In spite of the prediction of its enemies, the subordinate Granges of Minnesota are, as a whole, in better condition than they were a year ago.

The secretary's books show that up to date the amount of dues received is greater by \$1,000 than last year at the same time.
