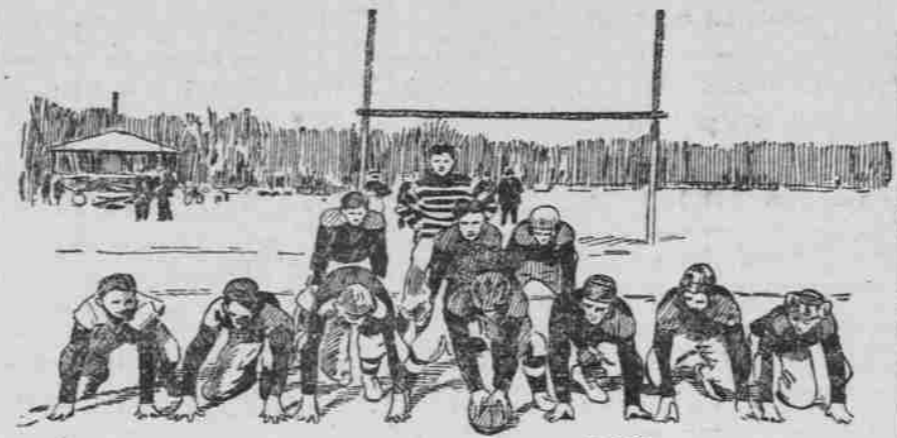

REDS ARE GAINING HARD ON CHAMPS

Haskell Indians Make Good Many Fistic Titles Change Showing This Year.

Kennedy Will Probably Coach Those Who Keep Places Have Lost Decisions.

Lawrence, Kan., Dec. 4.—The Haskell institute football eleven closed its season in St. Louis Thanksgiving day with a defeat, the Christian Brothers' college taking the long end of a 9 to 6 score. The team won six games this season and lost four. The teams to fall before Haskell were Baker university, William Jewell college second team, Ottawa university, Wentworth Military academy, Kansas University freshmen and Denver university. The teams which beat the Redskins were Kansas State Agricultural college, Texas university, College of Emporia and Christian Brothers' college. Although the red men suffered four defeats, none of them was by more than one touch-down. A place kick by Artichoker brought the Haskell team within four points of tying the Emporia game, while a place goal defeated the Indians in St. Louis last Thursday. The Indians scored a total of 196 points during the season, while their opponents were rolling up 94.

The past season was Coach Albert R. Kennedy's second year with the red men. Kennedy enjoys working with the Indians, and will in all probability coach next year, but as yet no contract has been signed. Kennedy is practicing dentistry in Lawrence, and his connection with Haskell allows him to carry on his profession during the football season as well as to be with his family. His relations with the Haskell athletic board are pleasant and he will doubtless pilot the Indians next year.

Leo Roque, the speedy half, has been given a place on the All-Kansas team. Roque is a great ground gainer, fast as dirt and as slippery as an eel. He has perhaps gained more yards for the team this past season than any other two men. He doesn't know when he is downed, with the result that in carrying the ball he has often evaded at least a half dozen would-be tacklers before one finally nabs him.

Bomelsner, Yale and Felton, Harvard, ends; Ketcham, Yale, center; Pen-nock, Harvard and Logan, Princeton, guards; Englishorn, Dartmouth and Butler, Wisconsin, tackles; and Brick-ley, Harvard; Thorpe, Carlisle; Mer-cer, Pennsylvania and Crowther, Brown, backs.

The second eleven follows: Very, Pennsylvania state and Hoef-fel, Wisconsin, ends; Probst, Syracuse and Trickey, Iowa, tackles; Cooney, Yale and Kulp, Brown, guards; Par-menter, Harvard, center; Pizzotti, Le-high; Norgren, Chicago; Mores, Dart-mouth and Wendell, Harvard, backs.
