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PORTO RICO TROOPS MUST LEAVE THERE

They Get Sick and They Don't Seem to Get Well.

MANY SICK OF THEIR JOBS

Stories Which Show Neither Pluck Nor Honor.

POSSUMING NOT UNKNOWN

No Great in the Desire of the Volunteers to Get Home—Enormous Sickness Percentage

Ponce, Porto Rico, Sept. 27.—It is the well grounded and almost unanimous opinion of the medical staff of the American hospital at Ponce...

The volunteer forces here necessitate their removal north. Sickness is increasing and has been increasing during the past three weeks at an alarming rate.

The sick report shows over 2700 in hospital, or in quarters, out of a total command of 28000 men, or over 10 per cent of the troops are on the sick list.

It is a significant fact that there is a wide disparity between the sickness in the volunteer and the regular commands.

In the two regular military regiments, the Nineteenth and Eleventh, the sickness averages only about 10 per cent, while in the volunteer regiments—the Sixth Massachusetts, the New York Engineers, the Fourth Ohio, Third Illinois, First Kentucky, Third Wisconsin and Sixteenth Pennsylvania—it averages 34 per cent.

In the last report, where the conditions are the worst, the sick report today shows a percentage of 45 in the Sixteenth Pennsylvania and 40 in the Third Wisconsin.

Over half of these regiments, which, with the First Kentucky, comprise General Ermer's brigade, are unfit for duty and yesterday when Ermer moved his headquarters up to Abasco, the summit of the mountain range, it was found that it would be impossible for the brigade to follow.

The command is prostrate where it is. Undoubtedly the wide disparity between the percentage of sickness in the volunteers and the regular organizations is due to the fact that the former take better care of themselves.

Most of them are veterans who understand the value of health in camp and their officers from the very outset have enforced with untiring energy the sanitary regulations so necessary for the preservation of health.

But more than that, the regulars are made up of volunteers who are not so used to the hardships of the war as the volunteers and they look upon their assignment for service in Porto Rico philosophically and make the best of the situation.

The volunteers, on the other hand, enlist for two years but with the almost universal understanding that they would be transferred when the war closed.
