These will include Dudie Archdale, 2:04; Billy Burke, 2:03; Anvil, 2:06; Baden, 2:05; Brace Girdle, 2:05; Cheeny, 2:07; Zarrine, 2:07; Annie Kohl, 2:07; Oakdale, 2:07; the California mare Helen Stiles, 2:06; J. Malcolm Forbes, 2:08; Shawbay, 2:07, and many others. The Lexington Meeting is always full of surprises from the fact that at that season many horses reach their best form and previous winners frequently lose form, making the result a matter of doubt. The Transylvania is the championship race of the year. It is the best known classic on the trotting turf and needs no comment. The October Prize is a newly opened event on the same plan, and the Free-for-All trot is the second of its kind at Lexington. It is hard to tell which of the above will eclipse the others. So go to Lexington early and stay there until the meeting is over.
