Princeton Presbytery.

Princeton Presbytery of the Presbyterian church, U. S. A., met in Mayfield, Ky., Tuesday, Oct. 5th, 1909, at 7:30 p. m. The opening sermon was preached by the retiring moderator, Rev. R. H. Anthony. Eight ordained ministers were present. There was quite a good representation from the congregations. Elder W. P. Black was elected moderator. Two ordained ministers were received and one granted a letter. Princeton Collegiate Institute was transferred from Louisville Presbytery to Princeton Presbytery. Miss Annie Florence Smith made a strong appeal in behalf of this excellent institute of learning, setting forth clearly that we have a corps of teachers unsurpassed in efficiency, that the instruction is the very best, that the dormitory is comfortable, attractive and sanitary, and that the entire management is admirable. The Pastor-Evangelist and Sunday School missionary made reports of their work, which were received as highly satisfactory. The reports of the committees showed care and thought in their preparation and presented the various interests of the church in a forcible manner. The discussions were pointed and interesting. Rev. R. H. Anthony will be installed as pastor at Princeton, Ky., on Wednesday, Nov. 10th. The committee on installation is Revs. J. N. Andre, A. J. Thomson and Jas. F. Price. Rev. Edward B. Landis will be installed as pastor at Paducah, Ky., at some date in Nov. or Dec. The committee is Rev. B. P. Fullerton, D. D., Rev. E. R. Kee and Rev. J. F. Price. All the churches but one are supplied with preaching. There was the most perfect harmony in the Presbytery from beginning to end. The ladies had very fine missionary meetings, more auxiliaries being represented than ever before. Their public meeting on Wednesday evening was a marked success. They have raised \$553 for missions this year. The presbytery now has five candidates for the ministry, three of whom are in school at Lebanon, Tenn.
