PROCEEDINGS OF TOWN COUNCIL.

MAYOR'S OFFICE, Bayou Sara, La., Friday, May 9th, 1879. At a called meeting of the Council held to-day, the following members were present: J. F. Irvine, Mayor; S. Weil, M. Alexander, J. A. Wells and August Fisher.

The Street Commissioners made their report, and on motion of Mr. Weil, the same was received and the committee discharged. The following is the report: To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Commissioners:

We, the undersigned street Commissioners, beg leave to report that in accordance with the resolution passed by the Board at the last meeting, directing us to make a town survey, to do the same and respectfully submit to you his certificate annexed hereto.

It was moved and carried that the surveyor's certificate be spread upon the minutes. On motion of Mr. Weil, resolved, that the report of the commissioners regarding the street closed up, &c., be attended to at once, and that the commissioners are authorized to remove all obstructions.

On motion of Mr. Weil, the report of the Committee appointed to examine the Mayor's, Collector's and Treasurer's books was received and ordered to be spread upon the minutes and the committee discharged. The following is their report: To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Commissioners:

We, the undersigned committee, appointed to examine the books of the Mayor, Treasurer and Collector, beg leave to submit to your honorable body the following report: TREASURER'S BOOKS.

The Bond of F. E. Powell for \$1000, as Treasurer, was presented, and being deemed sufficient on motion of Mr. Fischer was accepted. The Bond of Chas. Spencer as Constable and Collector for \$2000, was presented and being deemed sufficient, on motion of Mr. Wells, was accepted.

Resolved, That a committee of two be appointed (Dr. F. M. Mumford Collector be requested to act with them) to examine the tax roll for the purpose of ascertaining the lots belonging to the Corporation and whether any belonging to individuals are omitted from the tax roll.

On motion of Mr. Weil, the Mayor is authorized to swear in a deputy to assist the Constable to catch any hogs that may be found running at large. The bill of the Feliciana SENTINEL was reported as incorrect by the Finance Committee; who only found one dollar due. The item of \$6 00 was included in warrant for \$16 00 issued May 3d, 1878.

On motion of Mr. Weil, the Revenue Bill of 1877-8 was adopted as it now stands, for this fiscal year ending May 15th, 1879. There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
