FELLOW-CITIZENS.—The undersigned, in behalf of the members of the temporary Executive Committee of the Conservative Citizens of Louisiana...

At no period since the formation of our Government have questions of such grave momentous and vital importance presented themselves for solution as these which we now have to deal.

Thousands of our fellow-citizens have been swept into untimely graves. In every household there may be seen the habiliments of woe.

We have a new State Constitution made by a Convention assembled in 1845, in which the people of the State were not fully represented...

In the consideration and discussion of the many perplexing questions which now arise, it is well for us to bear in mind, that fanaticism is the cause of our great political misfortunes.

There unfortunately exists not only in the Northern States of the Republic, but in our own State a party advocating the most pernicious doctrine of universal suffrage.

NEW ORLEANS, August 1st, 1865. We have the honor of announcing to the people of Louisiana that the Conservative Citizens of this State at an invitation meeting held in this city...

1. To support the Union of the States and the Administration of President Andrew Johnson, and the policy pursued by our present Governor, J. Madison Wells, in reorganizing our State Government.

2. To maintain the right of suffrage, as it is now established by the Constitution of Louisiana, and particularly to oppose any and all attempts on the part of Congress to dictate to us...

3. To claim and sustain all the rights and privileges of the State of Louisiana, as they existed before the war, with the exception of slavery, which is forever abolished...
