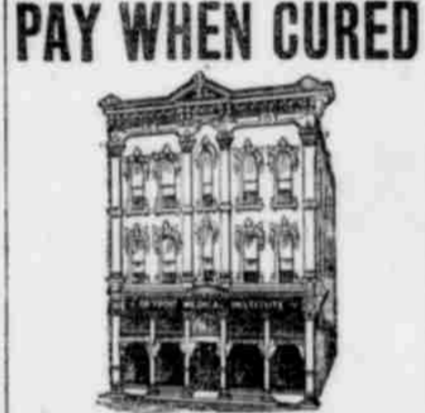

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

(OFFICIAL.)

Yale, Mich., April 24, 1903.

Council met in special session. President Fead in the chair.

Trustees present—Adams, Andreae, Fuller and Windsor. Moved by Adams and supported by Andreae that the bond of J. C. Holden with John Holden and Grant Holden as sureties be approved.—Carried.

The following report was received from the light and water board.

To the President and Council of the Village of Yale:—

Your light and water board would respectfully report that they have appointed F. T. Palmer as secretary of the light and water board at a salary of \$10 per month for the ensuing year and request that the appointment be confirmed.

Moved by Windsor and supported by Fuller that the appointment be confirmed.—Carried.

Yale, Mich., April 17, 1903.

To the President and Council of the Village of Yale:—

Your light and water board would respectfully report that we have made a careful estimate of the expenses of the light and water plant and would report that the same can be run for \$450 per month for the ensuing year.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

Moved by Adams and supported by Windsor that the ordinance committee be referred to the ordinance committee for consideration and report at the next regular meeting.—Carried.

Moved by Fuller and supported by Adams that the street deeded to the village by E. H. Drake and Alice Drake be accepted.—Carried.

Moved by Windsor and supported by Fuller that the clerk notify E. H. Drake and A. S. Parks to remove the fences from Drake street preliminary to opening said street.—Carried.

Moved by Fuller and supported by Andreae that the clerk notify all plumbers and electricians to furnish bonds as required by ordinance. Same to be presented at the next regular meeting.—Carried.

Moved by Andreae and supported by Fuller that all closets draining into public sewers be disconnected and that the secretary of the light and water board be ordered to refuse to issue any water permits for closets with outlets into public sewers and that any plumber connecting a closet with a public sewer be fined and his license revoked for one year.—Carried.

Moved by Windsor and supported by Fuller that any sidewalk taken up and relaid by cement without being condemned by the village council shall not be entitled to the rebate allowed by the village.—Carried.

Moved by Adams and supported by Windsor that the liquor bonds of Abner E. Jackson with E. F. Fead and Thos. U. Wharton as sureties be accepted.—Carried.

Moved by Windsor and supported by Andreae that the village assessment roll of 1903 as reviewed by the board of review be approved.—Carried.

To the President and Council of the Village of Yale:—

Your ways and means committee would respectfully report that after a due consideration, that they would estimate that it will be necessary to raise for the contingent fund \$1500 to pay outstanding notes given for the deficiency of the light and water fund the past year, and \$2000 to pay the village share of the arc lights and hydrants and about \$900 for the general running expenses of the village and that there be raised for the highway fund, \$1000 for cement sidewalks and \$200 for culverts and about \$500 for incidental highway purposes, and for the sinking fund the sum of \$500 to pay the interest on the bonded indebtedness.

All of which is respectfully submitted.
