

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Official Proceedings

October 6, 1941.
A regular meeting of the Board of Education of the School District of the City of Wyandotte, Michigan was held in the General Office, Roosevelt High School on Monday, October 6, 1941. The meeting was called to order by the president, Chas. H. Block at 7:35 P.M. There were present: Trustees Allman, Block, Harriott, Jacobson, McInerney and Steele. Absent: Trustee Homeister.

Trustee Allman moved that the minutes of the regular meeting of September 15, 1941 stand approved as recorded.
Trustee Jacobson seconded the motion.

Ayes: Trustees Allman, Block, Harriott, Jacobson, McInerney and Steele.
Nays: None.

The following is the report and recommendations of the superintendent, Wyandotte, Michigan:

The Board of Education Gentlemen:
A blanket insurance policy has been prepared in the amount of \$100,000 to cover the three temporary buildings now moved to the Roosevelt shop and the equipment therein. This policy is to be cancelled and included in the general insurance plan next January. All present holders of insurance on these buildings are included on the short term policy. The rates are to be determined by the Michigan Inspection Bureau.

The Roosevelt School is cooperating with the Municipal Service Commission in putting on the G. E. House of Magic exhibit October 13, in the late afternoon, for students and for the adults of the community in the evening.

Sketch plans for additions to the Lincoln and Washington Schools have been prepared by the architects. The Lincoln School would require an expenditure of approximately \$200,000 to increase its capacity to 1100 students and the Washington would require approximately \$175,000 to increase its capacity to 1300 students.

I nominate Frank Murphy, day man at present, to regular maintenance work at a salary of \$15,000 per month. Respectfully submitted,

An Ordinance

An Ordinance granting the right to the Michigan Central Railroad Company, and to the New York Central Railroad Company, Lessee of the Michigan Central Railroad, to maintain and operate a railroad track on the east side of Biddle Avenue, commencing at Grove Street, thence running north to Orchard Street, with necessary and convenient turnouts, sidetracks and switches, and to keep, maintain and use the same for railroad purposes, and for the accommodation of the manufacturing concerns having sidetracks in connection therewith.
Section 2. All ordinances conflicting with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
Section 3. There shall be no turnouts, sidetracks or switches running west of said main track. Said The Michigan Central Railroad Company, and The New York Central Railroad Company, Lessee of the Michigan Central Railroad, shall maintain the paving between the tracks at all street crossings in suitable repair.
Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect as of October 22, 1941, and shall continue in force for and during the period of thirty (30) years from and after October 22, 1941.
