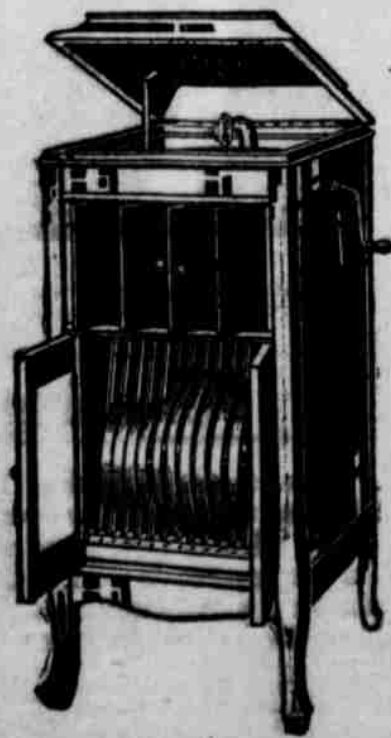

From Governor Sleeper's Proclamation of October 4, 1917.

"Michigan's sons are going forth to defend the nation. Michigan must stand as one man behind them and provide a full share of whatever financial support may be required. Nothing must be left undone, no matter what the cost, to win this war and win it speedily. Let us not do half-heartedly the part that may be ours in the conflict, but so lend ourselves and whatever we may have to the cause of humanity that the clenched hand of an outraged civilization may strike not only heavily but quickly. *****"

"I further designate the fifteenth day of October as Patriotic Day *****. On this day, or the evening thereof, let a meeting be held in every school house in Michigan, with a program suitable to the occasion, the children participating, and let careful consideration be given to the progress of the work and its further promotion."

A meeting was held in the Council Chambers at 1:30 Monday afternoon to organize for the 2nd Liberty Loan drive, and Wm. H. Learmont was appointed chairman and E. F. Fead secretary and treasurer. Sub-committees will be appointed and the city of Yale and townships of Brockway and Lynn will be divided into districts and a house to house canvass will be made.

The allotment for the 9th district, which comprises the city of Yale has been set at \$60,000. This seems like a large amount to be sold in a short time, but if everyone puts their shoulders to the wheel, the same will be made up without a question. Buy your liberty bond now.

St. Clair county's quota of the

second Liberty Loan is approximately \$1,623,600, and the county has been divided as follows with the district number and the amount each district is to purchase:

District No. 1, \$1,000,000—Including the city of Port Huron and Port Huron and Fort Gratiot townships.

District No. 2, \$150,000—City of St. Clair and St. Clair, East China and Columbus townships.

District No. 3, \$111,000—City of Marine City and China, Cottrellville and Casco townships.

District No. 4, \$63,000—Algonac and Clay and Ira townships.

District No. 5, \$40,000—Jeddo and Burtchville, Grant and Clyde townships.

District No. 6, \$40,000—Smith Creek, Kimball and Wales townships.

District No. 7, \$33,000—Memphis, and Riley township.

District No. 8, \$60,000—Capac and Mussey and Berlin townships.

District No. 9, \$60,000—Yale and Brockway and Lynn townships.

District No. 10, \$40,000—Avoca and Kenockee and Greenwood townships.

District No. 11, \$30,000—Emmett and Emmett township.

The big campaign in this county to sell \$1,623,600 worth of the second Liberty Loan bonds will start October 15th. Above we give an outline of the manner in which St. Clair county has been districted showing the apportionment for each of the eleven districts in the county.

It is expected that each and every one of the districts will make good. In making the assessments, equalized valuations have been taken into consideration. The Port Huron districts assumed an additional \$200,000 above its quota. This amount was deducted from other sections where, because of summer residents or other reasons they were entitled to special consideration.

Here are the facts in connection with the second Liberty Loan of \$3,000,000,000.

1. Its a loan and not a gift to the United States government.
2. It draws four per cent interest without taxes as long as you live.
3. You can buy a bond on the dollar down, dollar a week plan from any bank.
4. It's the best security in the world. It's like a mortgage on the whole United States.
5. You can leave your bonds with your banker in his safety deposit vault for safe keeping if you so desire. It's a receipt for the money you deposit in the treasury of the United States.
6. If you need money you can borrow on it, at a moment's notice. Ask any banker.
7. If the next bond issue is at a higher rate you can exchange your four per cent bond for a bond in the new issue at a higher rate.

Uncle Sam wants every citizen of St. Clair county just as he wants every citizen of the United States to buy a Liberty Bond. Unless the wage earners and the farmers and citizens of every class respond to their country's call, the second Liberty Loan will be a failure.

No man in the country is more vitally interested in the second Liberty Loan than the farmer. Upon a victorious peace will depend the early return of his boy who has gone to the front and a sure market at fair prices for what the farmer has to sell.
