Election NOTICE

Biennial Spring Election and ANNUAL CITY ELECTION

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF CRYSTAL FALLS, STATE OF MICHIGAN

NOTICE is hereby given that the next ensuing Biennial Spring Election and Annual City Election will be held on MONDAY,

APRIL 4

A. D. 1921

At the places in the several Wards or Precincts, as indicated below, viz:

First Ward, Captain's office, Great Western Mine

Second Ward, Lockwood Hotel Building

Third Ward, Basement of the City Hall.

At which election the following officers are to be voted for, viz:

STATE—Two Justices of the Supreme Court, full term; one Justice of the Supreme Court, to fill vacancy (term expiring Dec. 31, 1923); two Regents of the University; one Superintendent of Public Instruction; one Member State Board of Education; two Members State Board of Agriculture; one State Highway Commissioner.

CITY OF CRYSTAL FALLS—One Mayor for Term of Three Years and one Justice of the Peace for Term of Four Years.

Proposed Amendment to the Constitution

To amend Article 10 of the Constitution of the State of Michigan, by adding a section thereto, to stand as Section 20 and to read as follows

Sec. 20. The State shall borrow not to exceed Thirty Million Dollars, pledge its faith and credit and issue its notes or bonds therefor, for the purpose of paying to each person who entered into the military, naval or marine forces of the United States between April 6th nineteen hundred seventeen, and November eleventh, nineteen hundred eighteen, and served honestly and faithfully therein during the late World War and who was a resident in this State at the time of entering such service, the sum of fifteen dollars for each month or major fraction thereof, of such service, up to and including August first, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

The polls of said election will open at 7:00 o'clock a. m. and will remain open until 5 o'clock p. m., of said day of election.
