

# A FURTHER REPORT BY THE UAW-CIO FAIR PRACTICES AND ANTI-DISCRIMINATION DEPARTMENT

- FEDERAL, STATE, AND MUNICIPAL FEPC WITH ENFORCEMENT POWERS;
- EQUAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY WITHOUT SEGREGATION OR OTHER DISCRIMINATION;
- ANTI-POLL TAX LEGISLATION;
- ANTI-LYNCH LEGISLATION;
- EQUAL PUBLIC ACCOMMODATION BACKED BY LAW;
- MEASURES TO WIPE OUT DISCRIMINATION IN HOUSING AND ELSEWHERE THAT STILL FORCE SECOND-CLASS CITIZENSHIP UPON NEGROES AND MEMBERS OF OTHER MINORITY GROUPS.

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## THE GOP SELL-OUT ON CIVIL RIGHTS

The 1952 Republican platform and General Eisenhower have sold out civil rights.

No amount of high-powered advertising can rub out or cover up this fact.

### THE REPUBLICAN PLATFORM SOLD OUT CIVIL RIGHTS BY—

- (1) retreating from the 1948 and 1944 pledges for a Federal FEPC and
- (2) keeping silent on abolishing the FILIBUSTER, now protected by the GOP-Dixiecrat gang in the Senate.

### GENERAL EISENHOWER SOLD OUT CIVIL RIGHTS BY—

Saying again and again that Federal FEPC legislation is bad.

He did not bother to state in what years or century his method of education and local action would get Negroes jobs in those states where employment offices are still closed to Negroes, or are open only on a Jim Crow basis.

His silence on the filibuster echoes the silence of the Republican platform. In the ears of all who are fighting for civil rights, this silence speaks louder than words.

### THE PAY-OFF CAME OCTOBER 1 IN COLUMBIA, S. C.—

When General Eisenhower and Governor James Byrnes of South Carolina met, had lunch and embraced each other's political philosophy to the extent that Governor Byrnes declared that he will vote November 4 for General Eisenhower.

### WHAT DOES THE BYRNES PAY-OFF MEAN?

Byrnes is the evil genius, the real brain and leader of the Dixiecrat movement. On March 16, 1951, he said that, if the United States Supreme Court decides against segregation in public schools in cases now before the high court, he will close the public schools in South Carolina. Here are Byrnes' own words:

"Of only one thing can we be certain. South Carolina will not now, nor for some years to come, mix white and Negro children in our public schools . . .

"If the court changes what is now the law of the land, we will abandon the public school system."

Byrnes, a former Justice of the Supreme Court, tries to intimidate that Court in a pending case. He attacks the Court's possible verdict in advance.

Eisenhower could not have made the Republican alliance with the Dixiecrats plainer than he did by his personal surrender on October 1 to the Dixiecrats' commander-in-chief.

James Byrnes, the Dixiecrat Governor of South Carolina, wrote General Eisenhower's Columbia, S. C. speech delivered October 1, according to NEWSWEEK Magazine. In its October 13 issue, NEWSWEEK said Byrnes, "the Truman-hating Dixiecrat," shipped the speech to Eisenhower's New York headquarters and it was accepted.

### THE GENERAL SURRENDERS TO THE DIXIECRATS



COLUMBIA, S. C.—General Eisenhower made a pilgrimage to Columbia, to surrender to Governor James Byrnes, the evil genius of the Dixiecrat movement. The magazine NEWSWEEK reported October 13 that Byrnes wrote the speech Eisenhower delivered in Columbia on October 1, the day this picture was taken.

### "WE ARE NOT GOING TO TURN THE CLOCK BACK," SAYS H. S. T.



President Truman, speaking in New York, October 11, 1952, said: "You and I are not going to let this happen. We are not going to turn the clock back."

"While the Republican candidate is whispering promises to you, he's been touring the South to woo the Dixiecrats into the Republican fold. What do you think the Republican candidate and Dixiecrat Governor talk about when they sit down together for lunch? Do you think they talk about civil rights? I think maybe they talk about taking them away."

"You can draw your own conclusion when the Dixiecrat Governor announces after the lunch, he's going to vote Republican this year."

### "SUPPORT STEVENSON," SAYS MRS. F. D. R.



Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt said October 20, 1952: "We have seen General Eisenhower agree with Gov. Byrnes, gladly accept him as an ally in the South. And yet the Republican Party is appealing for the Negro vote on the basis of being for civil rights. The two don't go together."

"Adlai E. Stevenson has shown us a quality of courage and integrity which is not often seen in political life."

Mrs. Roosevelt appealed to every citizen who believes in Civil Rights to support Stevenson.

## IT'S EASY TO MAKE A CHOICE NOVEMBER 4

### AGAINST CIVIL RIGHTS

THE 1952 REPUBLICAN PLATFORM, drafted to accommodate the Dixiecrat gang, ran out on earlier GOP pledges in 1944 and 1948 to support Federal FEPC. The 1952 platform avoided any pledge on FEPC or ending the filibuster. In President Truman's words: "It is the louisiest plank you ever read on the subject."

EISENHOWER, as long ago as 1948, opposed FEPC and opposed integration of Negro troops in the Armed Forces. Eisenhower now double-talks about "human rights" and says FEPC should be left to the states. Like the platform, he is silent on ending the filibuster. This means continuation under Republican-Dixiecrat rule of NO FEPC, NO Anti-Poll Tax Law, NO Anti-Lynch Law, NO Educational Equality, and NO unsegregated train travel.

### FOR CIVIL RIGHTS

THE 1952 DEMOCRATIC PLATFORM talks straight. It pledges an effective Federal FEPC. It pledges action January 3, 1953 to break the filibuster roadblock (Rule 22) which now bars passage of FEPC and all other civil rights legislation.

STEVENSON supports a Federal FEPC with enforcement powers. Stevenson has pledged himself to support action to get rid of filibuster rule and to substitute majority rule, thereby opening the road for immediate enactment of effective FEPC, anti-poll tax, anti-lynch, equal accommodation and other civil rights legislation.
