Edmund Wilhelm Knobie, "Nobby," fullback; lives at Grant City, Mo.; 5 feet 11 inches tall; weighs 172 pounds; played four years on Grant City high school team and half and full on last year's freshman team; 21 years old.

Oscar E. Houston is 24 years old, 6 feet tall and weighs 170 pounds. He is playing tackle. He made the freshman team and the "All-Americans"



last year, and has had two years' experience on the Kingfisher College team at Kingfisher, Okla. He was captain of the baseball team at the State Normal, Weatherford, Okla. He comes from Clinton, Okla., but Columbia is now his home. He is a junior in the School of Law.

James E. Pixlee, end; lives in Cameron, Mo.; age 21 years; height 5 feet 9 inches; weight 160 pounds; played three years on Cameron high school team; junior in School of Engineering; kept out of some games this year

because of parental objection; won football M last year; played against Kansas last year.

Felix Carter Duvall is 21 years old, 5 feet 10 inches tall and weighs 157 pounds. He has been playing half, but played end in the Washington game. Last year he made the freshman and "All-American" teams. Played football two years at the Oklahoma State Preparatory school. He pitched two years for the baseball team at the same school, and was on the pitching staff of the freshman team here last year. He is a freshman in the School of Law. Ponca City, Okla., is his home.

Theodore E. D. Hackney, fullback, halfback or quarter; Hollenback uses him anywhere in back field; considered one of best drop-kickers in the Valley; lives in Springfield, Mo.;

M last year; had five years' experience in high schools of St. Joseph, Omaha, Beloit, Wis., and Culver Military Academy; alternates with Klein at quarter. Played baseball on 1909 Varsity.

John Gilmer Miller, center; played on scrubs and "All-Americans" last year; 22 years old; weighs 170 pounds; 6 feet 2 inches tall; senior in College of Agriculture; home is in Montgomery City, Mo.; first football experience last year when he tried out at center against "Curly" Ristine, captain.

Ewart F. Johnson, tackle; home is in Columbia, Mo.; 22 years old; height 5 feet 11 inches; weight 171; senior



in School of Engineering; played three years on class teams; won M on the Varsity last year; said Roper of him: "The best fighting player on the 1909 team."

Alden Wesley Roberts, guard; home in Auxvasse, Mo.; 22 years old; height 6 feet 3 inches; weight 190; substitute on Varsity last year; tallest man on



the squad; holds Valley Conference record for discuss throw; senior in College of Agriculture; won M last year in track.

John Moss Nowell, fullback; 20 years old; 5 feet 8 inches tall; weighs 144 pounds; played three years on Columbia high school team; junior in College of Agriculture; home is in Columbia; freshman and "All-American" teams in 1908.

Grant Ray Hastings, "Sol," left tackle and center; lives at Grant City, Mo.; 5 feet 10 inches tall; weighs 174 pounds; played in line four years on Grant City high school team, tackle on last year's freshman team here; was unable to come out for team until three days before St. Louis game, since then, however, has been in every game; 21 years old.

Frank Burress, right end; played on the basketball team three seasons, and was captain of team last year; his second year in football; lives in



Joplin, Mo.; played on high school team there; senior in School of Engineering; 21 years old; 5 feet 10 inches tall; weighs 160 pounds.

MORE CAPTAINS FROM THE LINE

Only Nine of Twenty-two Leaders Chosen from Back-field.

Frank B. Thacher, captain of the 1910 Tigers, is the fourth right guard to hold that position. Most of the Tiger captains have come from the line, although it is generally the case that a majority of football captains are back-field men. Of the twenty-two men who have served as captains of the University of Missouri teams, thirteen have been line men.

One man, C. E. Young, led the Tiger team three seasons. He was captain of the 1893, 1894 and 1895 teams, and has the distinction of having twice
