EUROPE TENDERS WORDS OF SYMPATHY.

Memorial Services Held and Honor Is Paid Former President's Memory.

ROOSEVELT'S POLICY A TOPIC.

In Some Quarters the Impression Prevails That the New President Is Not Very Cordial Toward Germany.

St. Petersburg, Sept. 15.—The all-absorbing topic in St. Petersburg to-day was the death of President McKinley. The tone of the press was uniformly sympathetic with the American people in their bereavement and uniformly just in estimating McKinley's character.

MEMORIAL SERVICES IN BERLIN.

Berlin, Sept. 15.—The service of mourning for the death of President McKinley, held this morning in the American Church in Berlin, was very impressive. The edifice was heavily hung with crepe and crowded with Germans, British and Americans.

MRS. MCKINLEY BEARING UP.

Is Expected to Accompany Funeral Train to Washington.

Buffalo, Sept. 15.—It was definitely learned at half past 11 o'clock to-night that unless Mrs. McKinley suffers a collapse between now and to-morrow morning she will accompany the funeral train to Washington.

PRESIDENT MCKINLEY'S WILL.

Modest Fortune Left Almost Entirely to His Widow.

Buffalo, N. Y., Sept. 15.—President McKinley has left a will. The instrument was executed some time before the shooting, and at no time during his final suffering was there any wish or occasion to revise it or to frame a codicil.
