ILLINOIS ARRANGES ELABORATE EXHIBIT. FORESTRY PLANS FOR FAIR COMPLETE.

Plans of Superintendent Bayless for Educational Display Are Approved.

THOROUGH CLASSIFICATION. TIMBER TESTING A FEATURE.

City and County Superintendents Instructed How to Collect and Prepare Their Exhibits for the World's Fair.

REPUBLIC SPECIAL. Springfield, Ill., Nov. 5.—Plans for the Illinois educational exhibit at the World's Fair are complete, and within the next few days county and city superintendents of schools over the State will be advised regarding the scope of the proposed display.

Under the arrangement, the exhibit is classified in two groups, the first covering elementary education and the other covering secondary education. In the first group are included country schools, semi-graded schools and graded schools.

SEPARATE BUILDING. In his address to school superintendents of the State, Superintendent Bayless said: "The classification of exhibits in the Louisiana Exposition has given the place of honor to education."

PROPOSED EXHIBITS. The department of the State to include floor plans and method of heating and ventilation.

Classification for high schools is arranged as follows: 1. Photograph of each and every building in Illinois, used exclusively for high-school purposes.
