NEELY LOSES HIS \$20,000 CASH BAIL.

Federal Judge Decides That Cuban Amnesty Cannot Restore Stolen Money Attached by United States.

New York, Nov. 23.—Judge Lacombe, in the United States Circuit Court, to-day handed down an opinion overruling the motion made by Charles F. W. Neely, convicted in Cuba of appropriating \$45,000 of its postal funds while acting as Director of Finances of the Post office in Cuba during the military occupation of the island of Cuba by the United States, to vacate the attachment filed by the United States against \$20,000 cash bail deposited by Neely with the Registrar of the United States Circuit Court in this district.

SIX CONVICTS PLEAD GUILTY.

Topeka, Kas., Nov. 23.—Six of the convicts who took part in the mutiny at Fort Leavenworth Federal Prison two years ago, when Guard Waldrup was killed, pleaded guilty to-day to the charge of manslaughter, and were sentenced as follows: Earl Emmerich and Harry Blackman, three years and fine of \$1000; Donald Morgan, four years and fine of \$1000; James Wilson, four years and fine of \$1000; Joseph Diekin, one year and fine of \$500.
