**WHEAT VALUES DECLINE ON LIBERAL OFFERINGS.**

**FAVORABLE CROP REPORTS WEAKEN PRICES.**

July Delivery Is Down 5-8c; Corn Is Up 1-8c to 1-4c; Oats Gain 1-5c; Provisions Unchanged.

Chicago, May 12.—Reports of favorable progress by both domestic and foreign crops were potent factors in weakening wheat values to-day. At the close of July delivery was down 5-8c, corn up 1-8c to 1-4c, oats show a gain of 1-5c. Provisions closed practically at last night's final figures.

**WHEAT.**

A firm undertone, due to heavy rains and lower temperature northwest, prevailing in wheat at the opening. Initial sales on July were unchanged to a shade higher, at 85c to 85 1/2c. A report that fire at Fort Williams had destroyed wheat crops in that section, and that the proportion of wheat was light, receipts of wheat were very light. The market also exerted a bullish influence. But trading in general was light.

**CORN.**

Corn was moderately strong on light receipts and on covering by shorts. Offerings were small throughout the entire session, notwithstanding the weakness in wheat. July delivery was up 1-8c to 1-4c, closing at 85c to 85 1/2c.

**OATS.**

In sympathy with corn the oat market ruled firm for the day. Small receipts, good cash demand and lack of any material selling pressure were the main contributions to the firm tone. The best bid for July delivery was up 1-8c to 1-4c, closing at 45c to 45 1/2c.

**PROVISIONS.**

Provisions were firm early on a strong market covering pork, beef, and lard. Later there was some softening, but prices settled to a little below yesterday's closing.
