LOOMIS'S DEATH CAUSED BY BLOW.

Physicians Testify That Wounds Were Inflicted Before the Body Reached the Water.

OPEN VERDICT IS RETURNED.

Nothing in Evidence to Support Suspicion That United States Envoy Met With Foul Play.

Kingsbridge, Devonshire, July 18.—"Found dead, washed up by the sea in Bigbury Bay, Devonshire," was the verdict to-day of the coroner's jury in the inquest on the body of F. Kent Loomis.

The evidence was not very conclusive and wholly conjectural, as pointed out by the coroner when he advised this open verdict, adding that although death was caused by a blow there was nothing to justify the suspicion that it was foully administered.

Consul Stephens of Plymouth has charge of the body, which is in a fair state of preservation. It will be embalmed and shipped to the United States for burial as soon as practicable.

The inquest threw the picturesque little Devonshire village of Thurleston, on the shores of Bigbury Bay, into a state of unexampled excitement. The court, over which the county coroner, Doctor Sidney Hackes, presided, was some of the largest ever assembled in consequence of the delay in carrying out the official medical examination of the body.

This was conducted by two local doctors, whose testimony was to the effect that there was a contusion on the forehead and behind the right ear, indicated by the extravasation of blood in the scalp and a rupture of the covering of the brain. There was also a general bruise, involving the scalp and the integument of the brain on the left side above the ear. Other injuries, in the doctors' opinion, were caused before death.

The American Consul at Plymouth, Joseph G. Stephens, attended the proceedings.

TO DECIDE UPON RATES TO FAIR.

Believed Southwestern Lines Will Adopt Same Passenger Tariffs for August and September as Now.

At a meeting of representatives of the Southwestern lines at the office of Joint Agent Hannegan, Missouri Trust building, to-day, rates from the Southwest to St. Louis for the months of August and September will be considered.

It is expected that the same rates applicable at the same periods are now in effect will be adopted.

The clergy arrangements will be considered and the rules and by-laws will be revised. A new Executive Committee will also be appointed.

MILLINERY RATES UNCHANGED.
