Anniston, Ala., Dec. 8.—L. B. Henry, agent of the Georgia Pacific railroad at Chattanooga station, has been arrested and carried to Atlanta, charged with embezzling large sums of money from the company. The prisoner admits his guilt and says he will make no defence. He said to a reporter: "You can say that I am guilty of the charge brought against me."

"That's an honest confession."
"Well, sir, I am guilty and am ready to take the consequences."
"How did you get into this trouble?"
"By befriending a friend."
"Who was the friend?"
"That I will never tell. I can shield him and I will do it. He was behind with the road, and I took the money to help him out. He has never returned this money. I do not think he is able to do so. He has a wife and five little children, and I could not stand to see him disgraced, though by befriending him I have brought disgrace upon myself."

"You won't give this friend's name?"
"No, sir; I will not. I will never do it. When I took the money I thought he would return it. I could have carried this matter along, but I thought it best to make a clean sweep. A few days ago I wrote Captain Sage a letter and told him I was short in my accounts with the road and that I was willing to let my salary go every month towards making up the deficiency. 
