August 21, 1890, H. C. Timmonds commenced a suit for P. H. Cherry, against the Gulf railroad, to recover \$1,000 damages for being ejected from the defendant's train, a few weeks previous. The case up for a hearing at the February term, 1891, and judgment of non suit rendered. The case as set forth at the trial was as follows: Cherry bought a round trip ticket from Lamar to Grandin, Missouri, over the Kansas City, Ft. Scott & Memphis road, in August 1890, the ticket allowing him the privilege of stopping over at all points. Arriving at Willow Springs, he informed the conductor that he wished to stop off at Winona, 38 miles east. The conductor tore off a coupon from the ticket and returned it to Cherry, who left the train at Winona. The next morning he boarded the same train with the same conductor in charge, to continue his journey to Grandin, but upon presenting his ticket he was refused passage on it, the conductor demanding cash fare. At the next station he was forcibly ejected from the train. He brought suit for damages, was beaten in the lower court and appealed. The counsel for the railroad contended that he should have paid his fare and then brought suit for money paid under duress, but the court of appeals held that it was not incumbent upon Cherry to purchase a right he already owned and had paid for. The decision of the lower court was accordingly reversed and the case remanded for a new trial. This is another proof of Mr. Timmonds' ability as a lawyer. This case was hotly contested by able counsel for the railroad company. The case will in all probability be set for retrial at the earliest possible date.—Lamar Democrat.

Kansas City Grain Market.

KANSAS CITY, Jan. 20.—Cattle—Large lot of hard wheat sold slowly for a time this morning and some early sales were low, but toward noon the demand improved toward noon and the last samples sold as high as they would have sold yesterday. Soft wheat was the lower and rather weak. Receipts today were 133 cars, against 44 cars a year ago.

Prices were quoted as follows: No. 2 hard wheat, \$8.20; No. 3 hard wheat, \$7.80; No. 4 hard wheat, \$7.50; rejected hard wheat, \$6.50; No. 2 red wheat, \$6.80; No. 3 red wheat, \$6.50; No. 4 red wheat, \$6.20. The corn market was firm without important change in prices. Shippers bought car lots actively. The local demand was small. Receipts today were 68 cars, against 84 cars a year ago. No. 2 mixed corn sold at \$2.20; No. 3 mixed, \$2.10; No. 4, \$2.00; No. 1 white, \$2.30; No. 2 white, \$2.20; No. 3 white, \$2.10; No. 4 white, \$2.00. Oats were weak. Receipts were 5 cars, against 14 cars a year ago. Cash prices: No. 2 white, \$1.30; No. 3 white, \$1.20; No. 4 white, \$1.10; No. 1 yellow, \$1.40; No. 2 yellow, \$1.30; No. 3 yellow, \$1.20; No. 4 yellow, \$1.10. Flaxseed steady; \$1.00 to \$1.02, according to billing on the basis of pure; small lots 2c less. Bran steady; \$9.00, according to billing, 10c less.
